
General Meeting Date Set for Sept. 23

Slow Down! by Scott Youzva, ONA President

Did you know that it is almost impossible to go thirty, that's 3-0, M.P.H. in today's' cars?

Well, contrary to this thought, all cars can operate at 30 MPH just fine. I can't think of a single good reason to speed through our neighborhood, since the longest route from any of the major streets surrounding Oakridge to your home can't exceed two miles. That means that you will only save a maximum of one minute if you drive 60 MPH instead of 30 MPH down the street.

Most people don't have to go two miles to get to their house and most don't quite get to 60 MPH., so you are not going to save even a full minute. The fraction of a minute that you may save is not worth the injury to a child riding his or her bike. That fraction of a minute is certainly not worth the \$50.00 ticket you could get (at least I don't make \$3,000 per hour). So, I beg of you, slow down and don't worry about that impatient driver behind you; you may be saving a life!
