SOMETHING YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT THE LAW:

A citation for violation of the City's sound amplification ("boom box") ordinance may only be issued to the driver of a vehicle. The driver of a vehicle violates the ordinance under two different circumstances. A driver is guilty of a violation if he operates the sound amplification system in his vehicle so that it may be heard from a distance of 50 feet away. The driver is also guilty of a violation if he permits another person to operate that sound amplification system so that it may be heard from a distance of 50 feet away. You should note on the citation whether the driver is the person operating the system or if he is merely allowing another person to operate the system so that the complaint will be correct at trial.




"Juvenile Delinquency"

GARLAND POLICE NEWS RELEASE:

The Garland Police Crime Prevention Unit has received reports of an endless chain scheme, also known as a "Pyramid" scheme operating in the Garland, Wylie and Greenville, Texas area under the "Friends Network".

These types of schemes are akin to "chain letters" where people pay money to a person on a list, add their name to the list and send it to a certain number of other people.

This type of scheme is illegal when a person pays into the scheme (by paying someone on a list for example) in exchange for the chance of receiving money for introducing additional people or from such additional people.

This type of scheme violates Section 32.48 of the Texas Penal Code, which provides that it is a Class B Misdemeanor, punishable by up to six months in jail, a fine up to \$1,500 or both.

Persons should also know that all information received in this type of offense will be shared with the Internal Revenue Service for review of possible tax evasion charges.




