

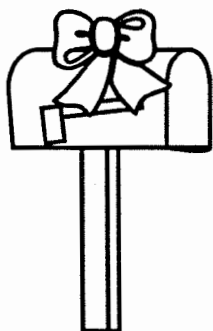

#### ACT I: "The Setup"

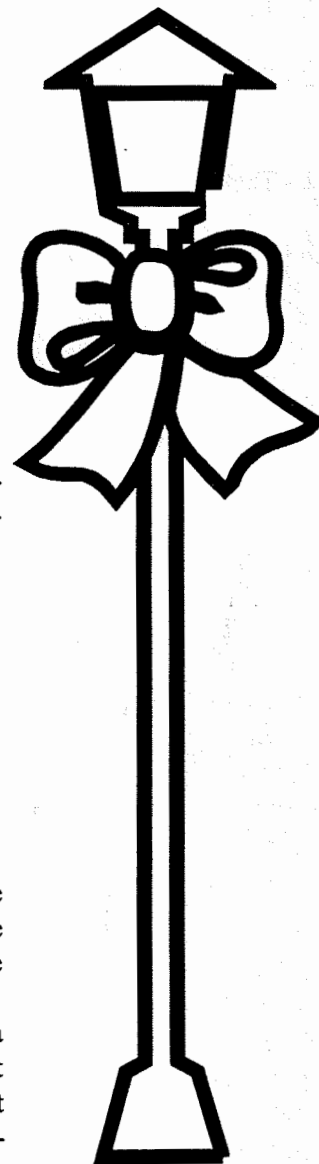

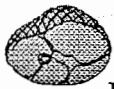

### Holiday Entertaining

With the amount of entertaining we do during the holiday season, it seems we're always searching for new ideas to make our events the most special occasions. While the food served is very important, a beautiful decor sets the tone for the party. Here are some holiday decorating tips to inspire you so your next party is a festive success.

A striking table sets the tone. Whether it's a buffet or a sit-down dinner, the extra touches enliven the occasion. Go the extra mile by purchasing special table linens. From traditional holiday red and green, pristine white, or a more formal overlay of gold or silver, the linens should convey a festive air, proclaiming the importance of the occasion.

Create a striking centerpiece for a crowning touch. A simple but clever idea that comes from the publishers of Beaker Homes and Gardens, is the "Flaming Cake Stand". Arrange crystal candle holders of varying heights in the center of a crystal or cut glass cake stand. Then, circle the perimeter of the plate with votive candles. While the candles are lit, be sure someone stays in the room!

For a more rustic look, select an oblong wooden bowl and fill it with an assortment of your favorite handmade decorations. A suggestion is to glue nuts on ordinary foam balls. ## TEXAS H.E.A.T. PROGRAM

Local police departments in conjunction with the Texas Department of Public Safety has kicked off a new campaign called, Texas HEAT, which stands for "Help End Auto Theft". Since most auto thefts occur between the hours of 1 a.m. and 5 a.m., police are asking motorists who do not usually drive their cars during this time period, to place the special HEAT stickers on their cars.

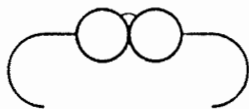
When the police see vehicles with these stickers on the streets between 1 a.m. and 5 a.m., they will assume the vehicle is stolen and will pull the driver over.

To register your car, the vehicle owner must present the title, a valid drivers license, proof of insurance, vehicle registration receipt and a phone number where the owner may be reached between 1 a.m. and 5 a.m. The cost is only \$2.00 and the vehicle is registered for four years. In the event the car is sold during this four year period, the owner must notify the Police Department in writing and remove the decals completely.

Although the Garland Police have organized their own HEAT program in the past, the new DPS program should be more effective. This new statewide program will discontinue the old one.

This new program is performed by an office from the Crime Prevention Unit and it only takes about five minutes. You may call the police department at 205-2122 to schedule a time.

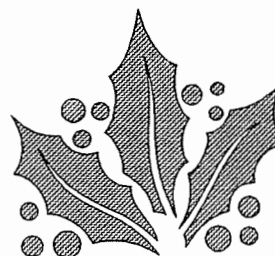

## ENVIRONMENTAL COMMITTEE

Thanks Again! Your continued support of the Environmental Committee is greatly appreciated. The ONA Pumpkin and Bake Sale held in October was very successful. And because of your efforts we are once again able to accomplish some extra beautification projects in the neighborhood. You will begin to see the following changes:

### OVERVIEW DRIVE

We are bringing in dirt to fill the low lying areas around the Bradford pear trees. These trees have had some wash out around the base which is allowing the water to sit dormant and accumulate around the base of the trees and also under ground near the root system. This dirt fill should eliminate the excess water drainage and improve the condition of the trees.

### BUCKINGHAM AND SHILOH

Our landscaping contractor will do a "one time" pick up of trash, mowing, and edging of these two streets during the month of November. We realize the need for more attention to these streets but our current budget just doesn't allow for it. This will be an item for next years budget when it comes up for review. Hopefully we will have continued growth in our membership to help cover this in next year's budget.

### RIDGE OAK/JUPITER

Marcus Medina, our landscaping contractor, contacted us and indicated he wanted to show his appreciation to the neighborhood for giving him the maintenance contract for this year. Marcus will plant pansies at no cost to the Association in the planter boxes at Ridge Oak/Jupiter.

### LAUREL OAKS/BELTLINE

We will be planting pansies in the small flower beds. We had to cut a tree down on the parkway this summer due to a storm pulling the tree out of the ground by its roots. When we removed the tree we did not clean out the roots or fill the hole with dirt. Also the remaining trees on the parkway have very exposed roots and need to have some fill dirt put in around them to prevent damage to the roots.

### WATERWAY BEHIND APARTMENT COMPLEX ON BELTLINE

We have contacted the City once again to see if we can get a regular mowing done on this waterway. Again, we must remember this is not a City waterway. This waterway is the property of the apartment complex. The owners will be notified that the waterway must be mowed to prevent a city fine being assessed.

Thanks again for your financial support on these extra projects. At any time that you "would like to donate money" towards further beautification just issue a check to the Oakridge Neighborhood Association and indicate on the check it is for beautification project.

Have a wonderful holiday season. This has been a very successful year for the ONA through the efforts of all our neighbors and friends. We are looking forward to next year. Be sure to ask a neighbor or friend if they are members of the ONA and tell them about our accomplishments during 1994.
