Even though the enrollment in the Garland Independent School District - more than 40,000 students - rivals the population of many cities in Texas, the district continues to rank high in test scores, number of student graduating and number of students going on to college.

There are many reasons for the GISD's successes. The district hires quality teachers, who are backed up by professional principals and administrators. Those administrators constantly update the district's curriculum to make sure what the students are learning is up to date.

A very important key to the district's success is the involvement of parents and businesses and in the education of the community's youngsters. Teachers will tell you that the single thing most helpful to educating students is parents and others who care to get involved and the district has made several options for getting involved available.

Responsible for making sure the Garland Independent School District is the best it can be is a handful of citizens who volunteer their time, energy and effort to the cause of education. This month, the members of the GISD board of trustees are recognized for their hard work during Board Appreciation Month.

Being a trustee in the GISD is not easy. Besides handling the educational concerns of 40,000 students and their parents, board members are also responsible for ensuring those student's safety, making sure there is adequate transportation to get them to school and making sure there are activities that will help the students become well rounded people.

All this is a difficult task in a multicultural, multilingual district that has a school choice program and a court mandated desegregation order. Add to that the political job of getting elected to the board, and you can see how the board's seven members don't always get the appreciation they deserve.

So during February, the. best way to let Mike Boyd, Randy Clark, Sydna Gordon, Anne Hamilton, Steve Hill, Randy Ray and Tommy Reed know you appreciate their effort is to show up at a school board meeting and find out what's going on. Show you care by showing up.



The statistics for January 1995 were up by 11 offenses from the month of December, for a total of 18. This was very disappointing since the two previous months had decreases during November and December holiday seasons. What happened in January?

The first offense listed above, aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, was a gang related shooting in which no one was hurt but unfortunately took place in the parking lot of the Country Club in the early morning hours of January 16th, which was a holiday week-end (Martin Luther King). The victims who were shot at do not live in Oakridge and neither do the suspects who were caught and arrested within an hour of the report. The

police informed me that the occupants of the two vehicles had an altercation at another location and the victims retreated to the parking lot when the suspects discovered them. All this information was reported in the Garland News and also discussed at the ONA meeting which was held January 26th.

I would also like to comment on another incident which happened in the late hours of February 2nd. This report will appear on next months crime statistics but since I was informed about it I wanted to relay the information to you. Several car windows were shot out with a pellet gun around 11:30 p.m. on the night of February 2nd.

The witness called 911 and gave a description of the vehicle, suspects and license number. Within 15 minutes the police had arrested the 2 suspects at a nearby convenience store.

If there is anything good to report this month, it would be there was only one burglary of habitation, whereas, in December there were 4 and November there were 3. The criminal mischief was up considerably, and I wish there was something we could do about this. The increase may also be due from more of us reporting these "minor" acts of criminal mischief. The police have always said to make reports on everything no matter how small or big. We all realize these criminal mischief offenses can be quite expensive whether you carry insurance or not. So make sure you call and report any problems you may be having. Windows Don't Have To Be A Pane

If you are like many consumers, choosing the right window treatment is a confusing process. Trying to decide between balloon valances, swags and jabots, verticals, sheers, blinds, cafe curtains ... it's enough to make you feel like having the entire window just walled off!

It's never easy to choose the right treatment; however, here are a few guidelines to help you get started. First and foremost, decide what you want pour window to do, and you've conquered half the battle. Does the window provide a lovely view, or do you need the light but wish to conceal the not- so -lovely view? Once you've decided on function, your choice should also complement the room's style and furnishings.

For our first example, let's use the window opening to a lovely view with no privacy constraints. The rule in this case is "the simpler, the better." One idea is to use some kind of top treatment and perhaps paint the frame in a rich, coordinating color. If afternoon light warms up the room too much, consider cellular shades. They are energy efficient and when not in use, they fold up neatly and almost completely out of sight.

What do you do with the window when the view is not one of great beauty? On the one hand, you wish to hide that view; but on the other hand, you need the light the window provides. Consider a treatment that incorporates sheers, which are back in style again. They gently diffuse the light while disguising the view.

For narrow windows, consider giving the window a wider appearance by hanging draperies beyond the frame. Do you have a short window that's presenting a challenge? It may be possible to hang your draperies from the ceiling to the floor, and use a concealing valance that extends from the ceiling to the top of the window.

It's impossible to cover the countless window challenges in one article (or in one lifetime!); however, we hope this gives you a starting point. Don't be afraid to talk to a professional decorator about your window treatment ideas. Today's decorators are more flexible to meet the needs of the educated consumer. You may be happily surprised at the creative ideas the two of you explore.


