### **CRIME STATISTICS FOR FEBRUARY 1995:**

The statistics for February were down by 3 offenses from the month of January, for a total of 15. As you can see from the list above, 14 of these were criminal mischief reports. We definitely had some "wild" happenings. Six of these offenses took place on February 2nd between 10:00 PM and 11:30 PM. Three more reported on the 16th and another three on the 17th. These also were around the same time period. I think most of these were damages done to vehicles parked on the streets. This total of 14 criminal mischief offenses was up by 5 reports which were made in January.

By now I am sure many of you have seen the Volunteer Speed Watch patrol stationed along Diamond Oaks and Big Oaks. They do not issue tickets, but do write your speed and license number down. The data is used by the traffic division to enhance public awareness relating to the speeding problems in the residential areas. Since Oakridge was one of the highest complaint areas, we unfortunately made the front page of the Garland news, Channel 4 News and the Garland section of the Dallas Morning News a couple of weeks ago. What a great honor! Some of the problems are due to commuters cutting through Oakridge from Buckingham to Jupiter or Beltline. Because of the increase of complaints, the traffic division will be periodically setting up

radar throughout Oakridge during the most active times of the day. So be forewarned, if you live in Oakridge, please drive the speed limit of 30 mph, at all times.

In this fast paced world we live in, everyone seems to be in a hurry, including myself. If we could all just leave 5 minutes earlier for work or school, the commute to our destinations would be less hectic and probably more pleasurable. When we are rushed for time, the first thing we do is increase our speed and become more reckless which could cause you and your family harm or some-

#### Color Psych

SUMMARY OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MEETING FEBRUARY 15, 1995 OAKRIDGE COUNTRY CLUB

A discussion of minor changes to the by laws were discussed. These changes addressed incorporation of the association, prorating dues, several deletions and other changes to bring our by laws up to date. These changes will be in the March newsletter for review by the members who will then vote on these changes at the May annual meeting.

A lengthy discussion was held on the possible increase of dues to accommodate the wishes of our members. Increased revenues would allow the association to pursue additional services such as continual maintenance and upkeep of our exterior walls landscaping, routine maintenance of sprinkler systems and projects such as flowers at various entries year around, master landscape plan for exterior of wall and implementation of same. This would require additional water supply to some entries. Replacement of shrubs that have died or become scraggly and mulching all beds on a regular basis are also considerations with increased revenues. A security patrol, although expensive, may be the desire of our members. It was decided that a survey would be distributed to the members for their feedback. Dues can only be increased with the approval of members. Feedback from the members will give the board direction as to what recommendations should be presented to members at our annual meeting in May.

Recently, a neighborhood speed watch was done by volunteers on Diamond Oaks. Police train These individuals to use radar equipment with 12" numbers display on a sign visible to drivers. Volunteers gather information for the Police Department.

Laurel Oaks was closed off to traffic while a commercial was being fillned for a soft drink company. Supposedly, it will air only in Canada.

Ron Harbach, co chair of the Environmental Committee, reported that the cost of maintaining (mowing and clean-up) the exterior of Oakridge every other week would be \$390 per month. A Monthly check of the entire sprinkler system would be \$40 per month. Anticipating an adequate number of members paying their dues, the board approved putting this in the budget.

LuAnne Payne, chair of the Crime Watch Committee, advised that the volunteer security patrol, which she had explained to members attending our last general meeting, would not be implemented by the Garland Police Department. They have elected to do a pilot project with this program in another Garland neighborhood before launching a full scale program. No dates were announced when the project would be completed. She also displayed the signs she had made with money from the passbook sale. She also requested new signs for general meetings as the present ones are deteriorated. She would contribute part of the expense from her crime watch funds. This will be discussed further at a later meeting.

The board also unanimously agreed that the generosity of the Oakridge Country Club

has helped our association tremendously. They have allowed us to use their facilities for our general membership, board and other necessary meetings at no charge. This is very convenient for our members and a major cost savings for our association. The Club has also been supportive of other endeavors such as: use of their parking lot for our pumpkin and bake sates, donation of flowers and contributing food for our Christmas dinner for our Police and Fire Departments. All members and residents of Oakridge should be aware of the support that Oakridge Country Club has given the ONA.



## CRANK-CRANK - VAROOM SPUTTER-SPUTTER-GASP-DIE.

Don't expect your boat engine, electronics and equipment to perform as they did just before you parked last fall.

- 1. Check/change engine oil, filter, lower unit and all so tilt-trim levels.
- 2. Check/change fuel filter and fuel lines and fuel stabilizer.
- 3. Check/add oil to automatic oil/gas mixing tanks (vro units)
- 4. Charge and test all batteries
- 5. Consider spring engine tune-up check spark plugs distributor and rotor, distributor cap, ignition coil and points (in older engines)
- 6. Test trailer light connections
- 7. Grease trailer bearings, check brakes and tire pressure.
- 8. Buy a spare transom drain plug

Most late spring and early summer non-emergency assistance calls we answer involve failure of the above related equipment.

Anita Russelmann showed a slide presentation describing how Garland developed into an area of 195,000 homes, 65 parks, 1 excellent public golf course and 5 recreation centers. Garland remains the third safest city in the state of Texas. Anita also explained the future development of the 190 Corridor.

Paul Mayer, President of the Garland Chamber of Commerce, explained how the city and the chamber have a partnership working together to increase the economic development of Garland.

Chief Larry Wilson talked about the direction the police department was gong to be taking and the issues facing the department.

Jeff Muzzy, City Manager, and the City Council members planned the meetings to keep a close relationship between the city and all the homeowners associations.
