The Oakridge Neighborhood Crime Watch will be hosting our 2nd National Night Out party Tuesday, August 1st. We will be gathering from 7:30 - 9:00 p.m. at the grassy area by the tennis courts and parking lot at the Country Club. Bring your lawn chairs, umbrellas (for shade), and soft drinks (no acholic drinks). The committee will furnish some munchies.

The National Night Out Against Crime is a nation wide event in which Neighborhood Crime Watch groups are encouraged to participate. The purpose of this is to: (1) Heighten local crime and drug prevention awareness; (2) Generate support for and participation in local anti-crime programs; (3) Strengthen neighborhood spirit and police community relations; and (4) Send a message to criminals letting them know that the neighborhoods in Garland are organized and fighting back.

Decorate to Unify

The ABC's of a good interior decorator's education include five basic principles of design: harmony & rhythm, proportion & scale, balance, and emphasis. Before tackling any decorating projects it helps to have an understanding of these five elements. A well-designed room uses each of these principles, but for this article, we will focus on harmony and rhythm which together create unity in a design.

Harmony is the eye-appealing arrangement of parts to form a consistent, satisfying whole. For instances a rustic, ladder-back chair may look completely out of sync placed next to the classic elegance of a Georgian console. As a rule of thumb, formal design works best with other pieces of formal design, just as country pieces mix well with other provincial pieces. However, today's style invites a more eclectic mix of furniture, so be careful not to confuse harmony with monotony!

Arranging furnishings and accessories like the way a composer arranges a musical score gives a room a sense of rhythm. For example, picture window treatments in a deep forest green edged with taupe brushed fringe. In order for the room to have a sense of rhythm those colors should be repeated in other areas of the room. Darker colors and large pieces of furniture carry more weight than lighter colors and small pieces of furniture, so they are loud "notes." Just as a musical piece is a mixture of loud, soft, long and short notes, so is the orchestration of a room.

Another way to introduce rhythm into a room's arrangement is through progression. Imagine a plant on the floor, a table with a lamp, and a sofa with a collage of art above it, arranged so that one component progresses in size to the next. Progression is often used in the grouping of accessories Various sizes of candlesticks and pictures on a tablescape might be grouped according to size. This does not mean that the progression has to be a straight line -- the grouping could progress in a turning line.

Take a look around your own home. Is the unity in your design scheme apparent? Or does there need to be some work done to accomplish a sense of harmony and rhythm? You'll get a sense of satisfaction whenever you walk into a room that utilizes these important design principles.

The statistics for June remained unchanged from a total of 5 offenses reported. Burglary of habitation was up by 1 report, but June being the first month of summer vacations, I was very surprised at the small amount of offenses.

At the monthly crime watch meeting for the North Sector of Garland, I was informed that 40% of habitation burglaries are due to open garages. The police can't stress it enough to please try to keep your garage doors closed at all times. Sometimes it only takes a minute or maybe five to walk in and out with several items in your garage.

Here are some helpful hints from the police that can help you and also help the police in locating any stolen property.

- 1. Record all serial numbers on any property you have. Such as bicycles, garage door openers, TV's, VCR's, radio, computers, even kitchen appliances.
- 2. Engrave your driver's license on any expensive items. The police have engraving pens you may borrow at no cost.

Other helpful hints for your safety are:

- Teach your children or teenagers not to talk about any valuables you may have in your
- Don't make announcements about vacations or work hours around strangers or in public places where your conversation could be overheard.
- The police say if someone knocks on your door or rings the doorbell, answer the door without opening it. This lets the stranger know there is someone home and will go away. You can simply state that you can not come to the door at this time. If it is a potential burglar and there is no answer, they may go ahead and break in.
- Make sure you keep an eye open for strangers following you home from a shopping mall or the grocery store. If you do think someone is following you home, don't go home, but drive around and find a safe place to call 911.





Rash Statements

"Who, (or is it whom?)" you might ask, "is this guy writing a column in my neighborhood association newsletter?" (If you're polite, you won't add something like, "It was just fine until he came along.")

Actually, I'm granted a somewhat conditional license to write this by virtue of serving as your current ONA Civic and Political Interest Committee chairperson, whose job it is to inform you of all the civic and political goings-on in our fair community. (If you read the first of these columns — about the Internet — you know I subscribe to a rather b r o a d definition of "civic and political.")

I chose this format because most of what happens in this arena is opinion and dialogue, which belongs in a column rather than a straight news story. Had this been a real news story, the civic/political report for this month might have read:

"Council Rejects PC Recommendation; Approves Cell Tower Near Oakridge

"The Garland City Council, at its July 18 meeting, rejected the recommendation of the Planning Commission and granted a zoning change request to MetroCell Cellular for the construction of a 125-foot cellular telephone antenna near the intersection of Buckingham and Shiloh Roads..."

Switch to opinion mode:

Our District Councilperson, Oakridge resident Richard Frick, was the only Councilperson to vote against the measure. What gives here? Why didn't the City Council sustain the vote of the Planning Commission and the person representing the affected area?

I had an opportunity to ask one of the other councilpersons these questions on the day after the vote; he gave me a twofold response:

1) No one (other than Councilperson Frick) showed up at the council meeting to formally object; and 2) the City needs the money that will be generated from taxes on MetroCell.

In the long run, Oakridge may not be hurt by a 125-ft tower within a couple of hundred yards of our perimeter. Technology's advance being what it is, this tower could be obsolete in about half an hour. Let's just hope the original agreement calls for removal of the tower when MetroCell is through with it.

The larger issue, however, is Council's eagerness to go for the quick dollar, when the Planning Commission and at least several Oakridge residents who called Councilperson Frick think otherwise. The short-sighted grab for tax revenue may indeed hamper development of single-family housing in the area. But then no one has ever come forward with enough money to buy the Wyrick Farm (site of the tower to-be) and subdivide it.

Now we have another zoning change request pending before City Council: the parcel of land that fronts Buckingham and runs from Jupiter to the first set of apartments. The request is to change it from residential to commercial. My feeling is that we've got enough commercial establishments along Buckingham, but, the City does need the revenue. What's your opinion. If this becomes a big enough issue for the fair citizens of Oakridge, we'll make sure they are heard at City Council meeting.
