Q. My husband and I are planning to re-roof our home with fireproof composition shingles. Can this type of shingle be installed directly over our wood shake roof or will the old shakes need to be removed first?

A. Cedar shingles are often confused with cedar shakes. There is a difference. Cedar shingles (wood shingles) are smooth sawn, thinner and have a tailored appearance. If you have cedar shingles, you can, indeed, nail directly over the existing roof, provided the shingles are not too old and brittle. To "tear off and deck"

is the "better way" and will give you a more exacting appearance. However, a "nail over" can also result in a nice finished application at about half the cost. If you do have cedar shakes, your roof is not a good candidate for a "nail over" application. Because of their thickness (1/2" at the butt end) and rough split face, a "nail over" would have a bumpy and unfinished appearance if they were installed directly over cedar shakes. Your shake roof should be removed and then a 1/2" plywood deck installed over your existing 1 x 4 lathe, prior to installing the new composition shingles.

The statistics increased from a total of 3 offenses reported in September to a total of 10 reports for October. Looking back at the offenses reported in October 1994, there was a total of 19, and 8 of these were Criminal Mischief. So there was a slight improvement from last year at this time. If I remember correctly, all of our pumpkins that we had on our porches got stolen and busted. I guess we were smarter this year since I saw very few pumpkins busted. There was a report made to the Hotline about a scarecrow that was thrown in a yard and a message went out to locate the owner. Fortunately, the owner was driving by and saw the scarecrow waiting to be found.

During the busy holiday season, please be more alert to suspicious activity and let your neighbor know if you are going out of town. Leave a contact number and a key to your house with someone you trust in case of emergencies, such as broken sprinklers or house alarms going off.

Here are a few simple precautions you can apply during the busy shopping season and everyday.

- 1.Make sure you have your keys in your hand before you get to your car, so you are not vulnerable to someone lurking around waiting for an easy target.
- 2.Lock your car doors after you get in. I have made this a habit just as wearing a seat belt is.
- 3.Ladies, if you carry a purse, DON'T leave it unattended in a shopping cart for even one minute. It will be gone in flash. I speak from experience on this one.
- 4. Keep your purse in front of you if possible so it can't be ripped from your arm.

5.Don't carry a lot of cash with you and carry only one or two credit cards if you are going on a marathon shopping trip.

These are just a few helpful hints that you can use at anytime but especially during the busy holidays. I hope everyone will have a pleasant and safe Thanksgiving and Christmas.

SELLING IN THE WINTER OR DURING THE HOLIDAYS

Most of the public feels that selling during the Winter or holidays like Thanksgiving or Christmas is not productive. If you are planning to put your home on the market you may want to consider the two major points in favor of selling during these times.

There is less competition for housing because a lot of individuals take their homes off the market for the holidays and during the winter. At the same time there is the argument that there are less buyers looking for the same reason. The point is that those buyers looking on a cold day or during a rain storm are serious buyers and have the need to find housing because they have sold their home, are being transferred or want to move before the holiday and celebrate in their new home. These buyers are strong contenders to write an offer and do not waste time and take 3-4 weeks to make up their minds moving only when they find the "perfect" home because there is no immediate need.

The second point is that if your home presents itself well with decorations, or a fire in the fireplace, it gives the buyer a homey feeling which is attractive and can result in an offer. It has the same effect when looking at a pool in the summertime when it is 100 degrees outside.

This does not mean that you will get more money for your home and it still needs to be priced right, but the old adage that "Nothing Sells after the Spring and Summer" is false. Many sellers feel that there are less buyers looking because there are less showings in the evening. Remember that when the time changes and it is dark at 5:30 p.m., buyers cannot see homes and are less likely to look until the weekend if they work during the day.

GONE TO THE DOGS!!




Yes that's right! This neighborhood has gone to the dogs! It seems like almost every household in Oakridge has at least one dog. We seem to enjoy our

pets. For the most part they are well fed and cared for. We don't all have them registered with the ONA pet register. It is something I have been meaning to do, but just haven't gotten around to it! Why don't we at least have collars with tags on them to show where they belong? They are house dogs and NEVER get out. WRONG! They do get out. In the last three weeks we have had three strays show up around our house - three that we and our neighbors have taken in. NONE of these dogs had collars on them. Our dogs get out on a regular basis.. They have a fenced back yard and some how manage to escape. They are always returned to us because they have collars with tags on there with the dogs name our name address and phone number. These collars don't have to be tight or heavy or expensive. You can buy both collars and tags at any pet store or your Vet's office for under \$10.00.

This is for your benefit as well as your dog. The first dog we found the owner while we were putting up the signs - we were lucky! The next two dogs were traveling together and after we had the signs up for 5 days, we were forced to call the Garland Animal Control, where they may possibly put to sleep. We had tried to find not only the owners, but some place to take the dogs where they would have a good home. Maybe someone might have put a collar on them and a tag that let everyone know this dog belonged to someone who cared. To lose a pet is heart breaking, but to lose one because you didn't take time to put a collar with tags on it, is careless.

Dogs adjust to new environment a lot easier than you can adjust to having lost a pet that you loved and cared for. If the dog is sick, or has not had all its shots, or requires some special food or treatment, these are all things that take time for someone else to learn and in the meantime, painful for your pet to have to go through until they learn. It may even cost the animal it's life in the process. So if you care enough to have a pet, take time to put a collar and tags on it!! Then when the little escape artist gets out - you'll get your furry friend back, in a timely manner, without searching the neighborhood for days!!
