## HOUSING INVENTORY IN THE METROPLEX

According to the latest edition of the Texas Realtor magazine, Research shows that values typically rise when the housing inventory is less than 9 or 10 months and generally do not increase when inventories are more than 10 months.

When there is less than a seven month inventory for all price ranges less than \$110,000, these moderate price homes will have the greatest potential for a rise in value. The opposite is true for higher priced homes in Texas. Homes costing more than \$225,000 are currently at a more then 11 month inventory and will have a low, if any, potential for increased value. The current residential inventory for the State of Texas is 6.8 months.

I believe that the other leading indicator of value is the competition factor. One of our biggest competitors is the local new construction in surrounding areas. With the interest remaining low many families are trying to move up in the marketplace. Oakridge, as a pre-owned neighborhood, has established landscaping and a good, quality custom feel. As we maintain and update our homes we can continue to compete on the marketplace with new construction.

### CIVIC & POLITICAL GOINGS ON

Let me introduce myself: I'm David Winter, civic & political liaison for the ONA. My wife, Dianne, and I have lived in Oakridge for 2 ½ years and hope we can contribute to the community. I assume the position vacated by Jack Rash who recently gave up the position due to time constraints. Jack set a very high standard of reporting that I will try to emulate. If you have questions, or answers, relating to civic or political issues that affect Oakridge, please let me know, and I will attempt to find an answer to your questions.

The most recent answers I have found relate to construction activity in the area. As most of you know, the construction on the new Home Depot is progressing very rapidly. Home Depot has moved the proposed date of opening to December from January as previously planned. Super One is still working with the city to finalize the plans for starting construction just north of Home Depot, and plans to start construction in the near future. The land on the southeast corner of Jupiter & Buckingham is on hold since an anchor tenant has not been found.

Perhaps you have noticed that the southeast corner of Shiloh and Buckingham is being cleared. The city planning office informs me that there will be a 220 home gated community development located in the southern portion of the tract-110 single family units will be in the first phase. These homes will be 1700 sq. ft. minimum with an average of 1900 sq. ft. on 8500 sq. ft. average homesites, and will initially be accessed from Shiloh. Retail pad sites and a small retirement community will be located on the north edge of the property bordering Buckingham. Eventually, and entrance to the gated community will be accessed from Buckingham also.
