

For instance, the ONA has a very successful crime watch program, an informative newsletter, a pet register for lost and found pets, beautiful entryways, updates on surrounding developments in the north Garland area and most recently added to this, is the Welcome Wagon for new residents. Through the newsletter we have introduced many businesses belonging to Oakridge residents who provide a variety of services. Lawyers, dentists, repairmen, roofers, painters, a travel agency, cosmetics, housecleaning, pet sitting, shuttle service, alterations, tutoring and even offer a classified ads section. CODE VIOLATIONS AND ENFORCEMENTS:

There have been several vacant houses where the yards have not been mowed and have become very unsightly. When driving or walking through the neighborhood make a note of the address and call code enforcements. Anyone can call and report these vards, fences that are broken down and need to be repaired or junked vehicles that are on a driveway. Simply call code enforcements at 205-3321 and they will notify the owner of the property who will have 10 days to take care of the problem. If it isn't taken care of after the 10 day period, the owner will be fined. If they city cannot locate the owner after the 10 days, the city will mow the property within 7 to 10 days. So if some of you are wondering about these yards and why it takes so long, this is why. If there is a junked vehicle parked on the street, you can call the police non-emergency number at 205-2150 and the police will mark the car and have it towed. This is just another way the ONA is trying to help your neighborhood.

GARAGE SALES:

There are some who like to have garage sales and then there are those that detest them. It would be courteous when you decide to have a garage sale to tell your neighbors. If they want to have one also, then you could do it all at one time. You cost split the cost of advertising, too. We need to limit the flow of outside traffic in our neighborhood and this is one way to do it. If you put up signs, be sure to take them all down. Just think about it, if you have a sale one Saturday then your neighbor has one the next and so on, we are getting the same group of people traveling into Oakridge. You will notice on the crime statistics that a purse and a 35mm camera were stolen from someone who was having a garage sale. If they will steal from you while you are having a garage sale, they may think about returning later to see what else you have. So be considerate of your neighbors and put yourself in their place.
