on a Tuesday evening during a 3-hour time span from 6:00 pm to 9:15 pm.

With the holidays approaching, please be extra cautious when you are shopping. Be alert and observant. If you have lots of packages and children with you, ask a store clerk or guard to walk you to your car. It's always better to be a little extra cautious during the holidays when we have so much going on.

CITIZENS ON PATROL

The C.O.P. program has been doing a great job patrolling. Several of us have found open garage doors and have notified the residents. We hope this is helping to prevent some of the habitation burglaries due to open garage doors. Even at late hours, you all have been very appreciative that we informed you. Remember, we are volunteers and we are trying to patrol at times we think are the most active. There are a limited number of us and we can't be everywhere all the time. After the holidays, we anticipate the police conducting another C.O.P. training class which will enable us to have more hours and days to patrol. It's that time of year again, when we all get excited about decorating our homes and lawns for the holidays.



HOLIDAY CLEANUP

Remember trash must be placed in the proper receptacles at all times. The front, back, side yards and alley must remain free of all litter, trash and refuse. The receptacle must be placed in the proper location either on the front right-of-way or in the alley as designated by the Solid Waste Department for weekly pickup. Additionally, just a reminder, receptacles should not be placed out before 7:00 a.m. on the scheduled day of collection and should be pulled back on the property before 7:00 p.m. on the day of collection.

Large items such as trees and boxes should be placed on the right-of-way at the front or street for pickup. YOU MAY CONTACT SOLID WASTE AT 205-3500 FOR PICKUP. Please refer to your monthly December utility bill for the dates and times of the Christmas tree pickups or call the above number.

Property owners, their agents and tenants shall be jointly responsible for eliminating all trash or refuse to the center line of the street, the alley, rights-of-way and abutting property.
