CAP Review

City Manager Jeff Muzzy hosted a meeting of the representatives from each of the homeowner's associations of Garland at City Hall on January 9, 1997. Several topics including the functions of the Board of Adjustment, Plan Commission, Area Implementation Committees and Housing Standards Board were covered. Mr. Muzzy stated there is always a need for volunteers to serve on the various boards, commissions and committee that shape the future of Garland. Interested residents of Garland may call the City of Garland Secretary's office at (972) 205-2404 to request a form that will list the boards and commissions on one side and an application for appointment on the other side.

For those of you interested in attending a board or commission meeting, Board of Adjustment meetings are held on the 3rd Wednesday of each month at 7:00pm in council chambers, Planning Commission meetings are held on the 2nd and 4th Mondays at 7:00pm with a premeeting at 6:00pm in council chambers, Housing Standards Board meetings are held on the 1st and 3rd Thursdays of each month at 7:30pm in council chambers.

In the last C&P column, I mentioned site preparation behind the first three homes on the creek side of Winding Oaks at the entrance from Buckingham. A plat has been filed with the city Planning Commission for that site as Arianna Addition and as filed will have a chapel between the homes and the creek. Specifics of the chapel were not stated. The plat was denied at the Monday, January 13 meeting of the Planning Commission because all the information requested had not been made available, but will be re-considered at a future meeting. The full plat contains a total of 2+acres on both sides of the creek, but only the west side is to be developed at this time.

There has been tentative approval for a Winn-Dixie supermarket to be built at Shiloh and Buckingham, but no firm plans have been announced for construction. The Super 1 grocery at Jupiter and Buckingham has also not announced a firm time to begin construction.
