In last month's newsletter the Deed and Code Restrictions were mentioned. The Association hopes that the Oakridge residents will uphold these restrictions.

There have been questions as to why some of these restrictions are not followed or have been allowed to be abused. As you know, our Association is not mandatory (even though we wish all residents would join) and being so; does not allow us to have the funds that would be necessary to pursue the issues that may be unheeded by the residents. As individuals, residents have the right to bring suit against someone, who may be blatantly breaking the restrictions and as an Association, we can certainly make the residents disregarding these restrictions aware and ask them to correct the problem.

There are certain restrictions when broken that can involve the City, such as junk cars, parking of recreational vehicles on the street or driveways if the sidewalk is blocked by said vehicle, and shrubbery blocking the view of oncoming traffic.

We, the Association, know that some restrictions have been broken in the years past (TV antennas, satellite dishes, etc.) but since we are only six (6) years old and not mandatory it is nearly impossible to have residents remove them.

The Association hopes that the residents are proud enough of their neighborhood that they will follow the Deed Restrictions for their area in Oakridge without needing a reminder from the Association to correct the situation.

You will be noticing that in the near future new stop signs installed making two (2) intersections four way stops. These intersections are Diamond Oaks-Stoneridge-Big Oaks and Diamond Oaks-Moss Trail. The residents, who signed a petition to authorize their installation, approved these. We hope this will help make our neighborhood a little safer with the traffic.

Vehicle Burglary Overview

Thief stole clothes from unlocked car parked on the street. Occurred on Sat. 10/25 at 4:15 am.

Stolen Vehicle (UUMV) Diamond Oaks

A 1985 Chevrolet Silverado (locked) pick-up was stolen from Country Club parking lot. Occurred on Fri. 10/10 between 4:00 and 11:45 pm.

Stolen Vehicle (UUMV) Diamond Oaks

A 1995 Honda Accord (locked) was stolen from Country Club parking lot. The car was recoverd but the air bags had been removed from the vehicle. Occurred on Thurs. 10/23 between 7:30 and 8:30 pm.

Crime was down for the second month in a row. September reported 8 offenses and there are just 3 offenses reported for October. No habitation burglaries were reported and I hope to see our crime stats remain low during the next two months.

Remember when you are out shopping to be more aware of your surroundings. Don't go to the car loaded down with several packages where you have to set it all down to get your keys out to unlock your car. This is when you are a prime target for being abducted or having your valuables stolen. If you



know you are going to have several packages, make several trips to the car. The store clerks will watch your packages while you go to the car.

At home, make sure you keep your doors locked and take the keys out of the doors when you are gone. Set your alarm, if you have one and make sure you put your garage doors down when you get home and then unload your car. If you feel like someone is following you, don't go to your house, drive to a gas station or grocery store and then call the police.

These are just a few helpful hints to keep you from being a victim. Since the ONA does not print a December newsletter, the November and December crime statistics will be published in the January edition. I wish everyone a safe and happy holiday season. See ya next year!
