PLEASE HELP!! The Animal Adoption Center of Garland

The Animal Adoption Center of Garland is a non-profit, nokill dog and cat shelter (the only no-kill shelter in Garland). They receive no state, local or government funding and they are in desperate need for any cash donations to help them to buy the building they are currently in or they will be homeless too!

Pat Hall has been the manager of the shelter for the past 13 years. The owner of the building has let her stay here for free all these years and now he has to sell it. He has given her the first option to buy it. But she has to raise \$80,000 to keep her shelter open. All donations, big or small, are tax-deductible.

This shelter can accommodate about 40 dogs and 30 cats. There are 600 to 800 animals adopted through this center each year. Ms. Hall is very careful also about who adopts the animals from her shelter. She makes sure the animal fits the family it is going home to.

I am hoping that this letter will touch you as it has me and it will encourage you to send in your generous donation as soon as possible. Time is running out and those of us who have pets will understand how important it is to have a no-kill shelter in our own city that cares. CITIZENS ON PATROL: Alley Address Signs

In last month's Newsletter, we noted many homes in Oakridge do not have house numbers clearly visible from the alley, and that police, fire, and emergency personnel rely upon such markings for rapid response. Also, our own Citizens On Patrol use the numbers when reporting unusual activity or unsafe conditions.

The ONA has contact with a person who will make attractive signs to order for this purpose. These signs contain the Crime Watch logo in blue and white and the house number in large black print. These signs are readily visible day or night when attached to house or fence. The price for a sign is \$10.00, of which \$5.00 is rebated to the ONA for Crime Prevention efforts.

Anyone wishing to order a sign may contact Bill Johnson at 972-414-1665. Please supply your name, address, and a check for \$10.00 made out to Gerald Cowan. I will act as an intermediary and see your sign is promptly delivered. If you prefer, you may deal directly with the supplier of the signs (Gerald Cowan, 972-495-7062), but he reports that in the past he has experienced difficulty finding people home when signs were ready for delivery.

TEXAS H.E.A.T. PROGRAM HELP END AUTO THEFT

Texas H.E.A.T. or Help End Auto Theft is a voluntary statewide automobile registration program developed to help reduce auto theft in Texas. This program has been established by the Department of Public Safety under the direction of the Automobile Theft Authority as the result of Texas Revised Civil Statutes, Article 4413(37).

- To enroll, the registered owner of a vehicle signs a registration form with a participating local law enforcement agency stating that a peace officer may stop his/her vehicle if found occupied on streets anywhere in Texas between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. to inquire as to the ownership of the vehicle.
- A vehicle owner must present the following criteria to a participating local law enforcement agency: 1) his/her vehicle, 2) photo identification, and 3) proof of insurance and/or vehicle registration receipt.
- When a registration is signed and the ownership of the vehicle is verified, a color-coded decal will be affixed to the inside of the front windshield and another decal to the outside of the rear windshield to indicate the vehicle is registered with the program. A white front decal indicates the owner also consents to have the registered vehicle stopped whenever that vehicle crosses or is about to cross the border into Mexico directly from Texas 24 hours a day. A yellow front decal indicates the owner only consents to the border stop between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m.
- Information concerning the vehicle will be entered into the statewide computer file for purposes of enforcement.
- There is no charge for registration.
- Registration does not prevent the owner or anyone to who the owner grants permission from driving the vehicle during the hours of enforcement.
- The vehicle owner agrees to advise anyone granted permission to operate the vehicle of the H.E.A.T. registration.

- The vehicle owner agrees to and understands that peace officers will take certain precautions when making a stop on a registered vehicle during the program hours because it is suspected that the vehicle has been stolen.
- An individual who wishes to withdraw from the statewide program or transfers possession of the vehicle must fully remove the H.E.A.T. decals and notify the registering agency in writing to such removal.
