We will conduct our business meeting at that time. Once again I do not have a complete list of crime statistics to report to you. The police department is still converting and updating their computer system. They have asked us to be patient while they work to get this program working the right way. In the meantime I have two interesting stories I can share with you. The first event happened the first week in February and I will call it "The Tale of the Phantom Intruder".

Things were knocked off the tables and windows and she immediately thought someone had broken in her home. She quickly called the police and they soon arrived. Whether it be your next door neighbor or you could even leave an emergency number with the ONA Membership chairman, Mary Musseman. She could put this in the files to keep in case of emergencies. Of course you have to be an ONA member to take advantage of this. You could also notify the police of any emergency numbers when you will be away for any length of time. How would you like to come home to an unexpected surprise like this? Last year, a home had a gas leak and would have exploded had it not been for our own "Let Sue Do It" taking care of their house and pets. Just remember, pipes break, water heaters go out, air conditioners & heaters fail, and roofs leak. It is a good idea to leave the numbers of your favorite repairmen along with any numbers where you can be reached. This is what neighbors are for! Let's all try to be a better neighbor in this new century.

- Initiated city of Garland Beautification awards for residential, commercial and civic sites.
- Chaired Development Services Committee charting positive growth, infrastructure need, standards and trends.
- Served on the City Council's Public Safety Committee to enhance police, fire and emergency services.

Current activities; 12/99 graduate Garland Citizens Police Academy, school volunteer at Hillside Academy and Williams schools, member of the Garland Chamber of Commerce Education Foundation, East Area Implementation Committee and other civic groups.

I have given you a brief overview of some of my accomplishments as Councilwoman for the city of Garland.
