The Garland Police Department, as we know it, is 50 years old this year. The department, originally organized in 1951, has served the community with honor and distinction. From a department of 8 officers, we have grown with the community to a police force of 290 sworn officers, and 125 civilian employees.

As we celebrate the 50th anniversary of our department, you will see our officers wearing an anniversary badge. These badges are copies of the original badges issued by the department in 1951. Over the years, our officers have worn three different badges that are depicted on the tribadge logo you see on the side of our police vehicles. I encourage everyone to pay attention to these anniversary badges when you have contact with our officers this year. They are beautiful representations of what the original 8 Garland police officers were issued. In addition to the badges, we have purchased a 1951 Ford that is currently being restored to look like a 1951 Garland police car. Jerry Reynolds and his crew at Prestige Ford are in charge of the restoration, and a number of local businesses have donated time, money, and materials to restore the vehicle to its original state. We will roll this vehicle out no later than the Star Spangled Fourth celebration, and hopefully lead the Fourth of July parade with the '51 police vehicle. In the future, we will use the vehicle at various functions around the city.



socials would promote the community? The ONA newsletter was established as the medium by which information was communicated to the membership. It is the hope of the present ONA Board that those individuals who created the Oakridge Neighborhood Association are pleased with how the organization has evolved.

The current ONA Board (which has been in place for the past two years) has promoted the involvement of our organization within the city of Garland. It was felt that it was time for this to happen. For an organization to continue to look outward and remain open to its relationship with the City is a good position. There are many excellent functions which are ongoing within our community and these remain a viable part of the whole ONA. Many individuals that live in our neighborhood volunteer their time to the city. It was time for the City of Garland to realize that all of these folks live in an area that is first concerned for its neighborhood and then concerned about the city. The current ONA Board thought it was vitally important that the city understand and commit to our organization. If you have paid attention to the direction the city moving, you should sense the importance of why the Oakridge community be concerned. It is significant that the ONA is known to those who will be making decisions for the city. Neighborhood revitalization is coming to the City of Garland. Oakridge should be part of that revitalization.

Some ideas that future ONA Boards might be interested in pursuing:

- the creation of a "letters to the editor" section for our newsletter (if this is to be, then the newsletter should be distributed to the GISD Board);
- develop a comprehensive plan for the enhancement of the common areas including the perimeter
- the continued upgrade of the web site;
- resolve the need for the information line;
- the establishment of a community wide picnic;
- the implementation of a community wide Christmas decoration theme (think of how stunning the Spring Park community looks at that time of the year);
- analyze the cumbersome deed restrictions to see if they could be combined and then what, if anything, can be done to enforce these restrictions;
- work with the CPA and the State to complete the necessary forms to eliminate the need to file tax forms every year.

These are just a few ideas that, if completed, would continue to take the Oakridge Neighborhood Association in a positive direction. As one can see, there are a lot of exciting possibilities for involvement by each and everyone of the citizens of the Oakridge community. Where do your interests lie? Are you just interested in paying your annual dues and then let others do the work? That is acceptable, however do not become a CAVE person. What is a CAVE person – citizens against virtually everything.

Please look for the report from the nominating committee, on page 4 in this issue of the ONA Newsletter. If you are a member you will be asked to vote on the next slate of officers at the May 23rd general membership meeting.



ciation to discuss what the future holds for our police department. First, let's talk about some of the things that we have accomplished recently that will set the stage for the future. Garland PD has always been a leader in the acquisition and use of technology. For example, we were the first police department in the state to acquire mobile data terminals for our police cars. We have endeavored over the years to give our personnel the best tools possible to do the job you expect. By making our officers more efficient and effective with technology, we have been able to keep your cost for law enforcement service the lowest in the State of Texas.

With that thought in mind, in the past year we have acquired a new computer aided dispatch system, a new 911 system, a new records management system, and new mobile data computers for our vehicles. We are currently installing the last piece of this new technology strategy that will take us into the 21st century. In a few weeks, we will have installed wireless data modems in all our police vehicles. This wireless data system will allow our officers to write their offense reports in their vehicle on the mobile data computers, and transmit those reports to our records management system in seconds. This wireless data system will give the officers on the street access to any and all information in our records management system, including graphic data such as mug shots and geographically related crime data. This will make the officers on the street better capable of serving you the citizen.

So, what does the future hold for Garland PD. In the immediate future, we will be constructing a new police facility on land located at the intersection of Forest Ln. and State St. We are busting at the seems in our current facility, and are looking forward to this move. The project is fully funded, and construction should begin in September or October of this year. Included in the complex, will be a new police station, new jail, and a new Court building. Our architects have done a beautiful job designing the facility, and we are convinced that it will be something every citizen of Garland will be proud of. Included in the police building, will be a "community room" designed for meetings and other functions. We will encourage the people to be a part of the facility by making use of that space. We are told that construction will take approximately 18 months, so we should be moving sometime in early 2003.

Development and growth will definitely impact our foreseeable future. Development in the 190 corridor, and development in the I-30 corridor will definitely impact the demand for service that our department will face. One complex alone, Sanmina Corporations manufacturing facility at 190 and Campbell Rd., promises to bring 4,500 employees to that location. That is a lot of people and traffic to move twice a day. Add the regional mall at the other end of the 190 corridor, and the demand for service grows even more. Our officer per citizen ratio is currently 1.40 officers per 1000 citizens. That is the lowest in the metroplex. We have to prepare for the growth we know is coming.

Currently pending in this session of the Texas Legislature are several bills dealing with the issue of racial profiling. The Garland Police Department does not condone racial profiling, nor do we conduct our enforcement activities based on race or color. However, the legislation will require us to capture information related to every traffic stop our officers make. We are already at work on the best way to accomplish what we think the legislation will require. Depending on the final statute, this process could be costly and

time consuming as well as labor intensive. We are doing everything we can to anticipate the requirements, and be prepared to meet that challenge.

Over the next five years, I firmly believe that our department will have to add some additional services to better accomplish our mission. For example, I believe that we will have to seriously consider the addition of an air police unit. Helicopters have proven their value in the law enforcement arena. We have done extensive research in this area, and we are convinced that the need will soon exist as our city continues to grow. Helicopters virtually end the need for high-speed chases. That fact alone justifies the cost

As our city becomes more diverse, so should its police department. Minority recruiting will remain high on our list at Garland PD. We have made significant strides in this area over the past five years or so, but there is still work to be done. As Chief of Police, I firmly believe that law enforcement agencies should mirror the communities they serve.

As you can see, the future here at Garland PD is bright and exciting. We will soon move into a new facility that should serve this city for many years in the future. Considering what the city's projected population will be at "build out", this should be the last police station the City will build. Our manpower needs will certainly grow, and we must prepare for those services that will be much needed in the future.

I want to congratulate the Oakridge Neighborhood Association for being one of the most active in the city. Your efforts have definitely contributed to making Oakridge one of the safest neighborhoods in the city. I would like to encourage all Oakridge residents to consider attending our Citizens Police Academy. That program is our best opportunity to get to know the citizens we serve personally.
