We greatly appreciate the recent donations made to the O.N.A's environmental program. This additional funding from concerned and involved neighbors has helped make the entrances to Oakridge more attractive. It has definitely helped us make the improvements to our border on Shiloh! The Association has spent more than \$13,000 this spring making improvements with new sprinkler systems at two entrances, the length of Shiloh, the additional flower beds, and replacing shrubs at two other locations.


