It was the first time all members had been able to speak with Officer Gooch face to face and clear up some issues we deal with while on patrol. Numerous questions regarding speeding and failure to stop at stop signs were addressed. Officer Gooch gave us some ideas on how to handle these issues (some with GPD help). Let this be a <u>Warning---there may be some added enforcement of stop sign violations so</u> make sure you come to a complete stop. We are also looking into a way to reduce the number of door to door solicitations in the Oakridge area. Oak Point Vacant Lots

I wanted to take this opportunity to give you information about the lots. I have heard of several concerns about these lots. Hopefully this information will help. Unlike the rest of the neighborhood, these lots are not bound by any neighborhood deed restrictions. Why? I do not know. This all occurred back in the development stages of our neighborhood. Yes...they can build front entry garages and there is a home being built with a front entry garage. That particular lot had one side which had an additional 4 foot drainage easement making it a total of 10 feet from the property line that could not be use to build. The new owner is building a front entry garage, because he lost driveway space making it difficult to build a swing entry. Regardless of the lot size, the owners can build front entry garages. Please understand that these lots are selling at \$90,000. The homes being built are ranging anywhere from \$275,000 - \$400,000 making the total value any where from \$350,000 - \$500,000.

The investor who is currently selling the lots spent more money then originally planned to build the stone retainer wall, which already has holes for the purchasers to install wrought iron fences. They did mow a couple of weeks ago and had the weeds pulled. I think you will agree that once the lots are sold and finished with new homes it will add value to our neighborhood.

I am sure with that kind of money spent, the new homeowners care about their investment and the neighborhood. If you have any questions about the lots, please feel free to contact me directly.

Dear friends and neighbors of District 7:

I wanted to share with you a few updates on things happening in the city. One of the most recent topics was the appointment to the Texas Municipal Power Agency (TMPA) board. As most of you may know, there was a lot of discussion about this appointment. It is an important role because this person represents Garland at meetings and informs the Council on what is happening. Two verv qualified individuals had expressed interest in the appointment. However, in my opinion, this became a political issue between the two versus serving Garland's best interest. I nominated Bill Dollar, Assistant City Manger, due to the fact that he was a "neutral" party, and perhaps the most qualified of all. Unanimously, Mr. Dollar was appointed to the board. I know that his knowledge and experiences will benefit this city as our TMPA representative.

Presentations have been ongoing for the Community Development Block Grants (CDBG). Many well deserving organizations are requesting funds for their specific programs. There is no doubt that there will be hard decisions to make, as the money requested surpasses two times the amount available

Currently, we are attending budget orientation meetings since our actual budget process will start in early September. One interesting fact about our budget is, after taxes, on average each Garland household pays \$37 dollars a month for City services such as Fire, Police, Parks & Recreation, etc. (excluding utilities). We are also in the midst of planning a "We the People" conference, and I am truly excited about the opportunity that this brings to Garland. I will update you as more details come.
