#### **Dear Friends and Neighbors of District 7:**

I wanted to share with you about a recent trip that I took to Bowie, Maryland. Mayor Day, Councilman Hickey, Councilman Dunning, and myself flew on a Saturday morning to tour the Bowie Town Center. For those of you who do not know, this is the same mall concept that Simon Properties is planning to build for the Firewheel Town Center, along 190 and Hwy 78. Unlike a traditional enclosed mall, it is an open-design concept, and offers a new, fresh style of shopping, unlike any other in the Metroplex. The Bowie Town Center has approximately 550,000 square feet of retail space, and has been in business for about 8 months. We toured the shopping center, visited with several retail occupants, and discussed their thoughts on the open design concept. Many said that their sales where greater than expected some even 20% higher than anticipated!

The cleanliness of the facility was one of the first things that I noticed. Everything was clean, neat, and very welcoming. I was also impressed with how the flow of traffic, both foot and vehicle, moved cohesively. As I stood in the middle of the complex, I mentally tried to visualize a shopping center such as this in Garland; only twice as big, due to the fact that the Firewheel Town Center will encompass over a million square feet of retail space. The vision of this is truly exciting; and this

town center will offer Garland a unique and profound opportunity for a first class facility.

The Simon Properties has requested several variances regarding the town center. Variances are being requested due to the fact that the original corridor standards were not set with a town center of this magnitude in mind. Modifications were related to building materials, screening and land-scaping, and signage. The Plan Commission approved several of them Monday, July 22 at their regular meeting. All of the requested modifications were approved with the exception of paving material. This particular variance will now move forward to the Council for consideration. The Council will also review the incentive plan offered to Simon Properties at the next work session.

The Firewheel Town Center will play a vital role in the future of Garland's growth and stability. We all will benefit from it both directly and indirectly. ### **Status Report : Environmental / Commons By Chuck Teske**

#### **Seasonal Color**

Some of you who donated money for seasonal planting might be wondering why sping flowers were not planted this year on some of the entryways. The simple answer is that while these flowers might look nice for a few weeks, the irrigation systems on most of the entrances are no longer functioning. Your generous donations would be wasted putting in new plants under such conditions. Proper stewardship of these funds mandates they be spent **when** they can do the most good....

#### The Plan

Since assuming ONA environmental duties this spring, we have made it our top priority to revitalize 5 entry points into OakRidge. They are as follows:

- 1. Beltline / Laurel Oaks
- 2. Shiloh / Big Oaks
- 3. Buckingham / Diamond Oaks
- 4. Buckingham / Overview
- 5. Jupiter / Ridge Oak

In revitalizing these entrances, the ONA will be repairing and bringing up to City code irrigation and back-flow devices. Once proper irrigation is restored, landscaping at each entrance will be evaluated and reworked. Some of the plants in these beds date to the inception of OakRidge. They are simply at the end of their useful lives. Where possible, we will attempt to preserve original landscaping to reduce planting costs. Greening-Up and properly maintaining our entryways will communicate to homeowners and visitors alike a sense of pride and community ....the very reasons most of us live here.

#### **Progress**

We have made significant gains in reviving our irrigation systems and landscaping.

- Electronic controller boxes have been replaced at 3 entrances with 1 more box to be replaced by the end of Aug. Electronic controller boxes regulate when the irrigation system runs and for how long. The four functioning controllers have all been tested and watering times set.
- Control Valve replaced on Buckingham / Diamond Oaks making that system operational.
- Buckingham / Overview system tested and operational.
- Shiloh / Big Oaks system ok'd for metering by the City of Garland.
- Contractor hired for installation of new valves at Jupiter / Ridge Oak.
- Contractor hired for installation of new valves and backflow device at Laurel Oaks / Beltline.
- Landscaping completed for Summer/Fall on both Buckingham entrances. Beds
  were prepared with fresh soil, tilled, and fertilized. New Shrubs installed (15
  plants mostly Indian Hawthorn). Summer/Fall color installed. Upon completion of planting, beds were topped with hardwood mulch.

#### What Can I Do

As a member of the ONA, the best gift that you can give is that of your time. Currently we have need for volunteers for mid-week litter removal for the common areas that border Shiloh, Beltline, Jupiter, and Buckingham. Most litter deposited in these areas is from passing cars or from Dart bus riders who wait at the stops that surround OakRidge. Litter is removed every Monday as part of regular grounds maintenance, but by Thursday some areas are beginning to look trashed-up. If you would like to help out, I can be reached day or evening at 214-325-3286. Your donations are also welcome if you would like to ear-mark funds for a specific part of our renovation.
