



### From the Mayor

With the news of the budget deficit of the City of Dallas and the sales tax shortages of Mesquite, Richardson and Plano, I have had many citizens of Garland ask the question, "How is Garland doing?"

I am proud to say, "The City of Garland is doing OK." Yes, because of the economic downturn, the General Fund has taken a hit with declining sales tax revenue and drops in franchise fees. However, if the current projections hold, the City will end the current fiscal year (September 30<sup>th</sup>) slightly ahead (more income than expenses) for the City's General Fund. The General Fund pays for many basic services, such as Police, Fire, Code Enforcement, Health and Transportation.

Then the citizens ask, "How did we avoid the problems that Dallas and other cities have in their budgets?" I am proud to say, "We avoided the problems in two ways: Good Planning and Diverse Tax Base."

First, Good Planning: Even before the current budget was implemented in October 2001, the City staff and Council realized the impact that the slowing economy and the events of September 11<sup>th</sup> would have on the budget. They realized that early cuts taken in the fall of 2001 might avoid devastating cuts and deficits in the fall of

2002. These actions included a hiring freeze, curtailed capital spending outside of the Capital Improvement Program budget and a 5% reduction in departmental operating funds. Employees up and down the organizational chart looked for ways to save money without directly impacting services to the citizens. These early actions have resulted in a citywide savings of \$2.8 million.

You, the citizens of Garland, and I, the new Mayor, benefit tremendously from the efforts of the previous City Council and all 2000+ City of Garland employees to "handle then" rather than "ignore until now" the realities of the economic downturn.

Second, Diverse Tax Base: Garland has an expanding and diverse tax base. Although Garland sometimes views other cities with jealousy in regards to High Tech and Mall development, Garland's diverse business mix is weathering the economic storm. As the High Tech industry crashes and as new up-scale malls scramble for customers, Garland's diverse business mix plods on. Yes, other cities' budgets benefited from the boom, but they are now having to contend with the bust.

How is Garland doing? OK for now and the future is very bright.

During the August 22<sup>nd</sup> General Meeting of the O.N.A. we had two guest speakers. Both proved to be excellent "ambassadors" for the City of Garland as they provided our residents with some valuable information. We also had an unplanned demonstration by the Garland Fire Dept. as they were called to the aid of one of our residents who fell and was injured just prior to the start of the meeting. Fortunately, one of our guest speakers was Firefighter/EMT Christopher Balancier, and he administered first aid until the ambulance arrived. As expected, the fire department handled the "emergency" quickly and efficiently. We are fortunate to have a fire department like this serving our area! Later, Firefighter Balancier presented those in attendance an explanation of the proper use of smoke detectors, fire alarms and exit-strategies. He gave everyone some excellent pointers on fire I for one, came home and immediately checked my smoke detectors to verify that they were in fact in good working order!

Our other speaker, Detective Ambrosia, from the Garland Police Department, provided us with some insight into how the G.P.D. oversees the sex-offenders who reside in Garland. This is a subject that many

parents had expressed an interest in, particularly in light of the recent incidents on national news. Detective Ambrosia was able to help ally some fears as he explained that all "registered offenders", including the two who reside in our area, are very carefully monitored by the G.P.D. Please be aware that your Oakridge C.O.P. monitors the offenders who reside in our area also.

We all wish at times that we could stop some of the frequent "soliciting" that seems to go on daily in the Oakridge area, particularly those that ring our bells early on Saturday mornings! If you would like to get a "No Soliciting" sign, your Oakridge C.O.P. is selling them for \$10.00. The sign comes on a metal stake and is red on a white background reading "No Soliciting, Ord. 2651, City of Garland". Although we can't guarantee that all solicitors will "vanish" from Oakridge because of our signs we do believe it will make an impact and reduce the number of bell-ringers asking for money and donations and maybe cut down on the paper littering front walks and plastic bags hanging on doors for days on end, announcing to one and all that no one is at home.
