Jim Griffin, Bill Olive and Chuck Teske, Jr. have agreed to review our current ONA bylaws and make any recommendations to the general membership. Watch for their report in our April ONA newsletter. It is hoped that their suggestions will have a positive affect in the operations of our neighborhood organization. Their report will be voted on by those in attendance (and a member of the ONA) at the general meeting **May 22**<sup>nd</sup>.

Two very important elections to take place at the last membership meeting of the 2002 – 2003 ONA board term. The new slate of officers will take effect May 23<sup>rd</sup> and run through May 27<sup>th</sup> of 2004.

Have you noticed how many yards are being neglected as you drive around the Oakridge area? There are three phone numbers listed in the boxed section labeled "important phone numbers" that you should have posted on your refrigerator (icebox for those of us who remember that far back) for quick reference. The three important numbers belong to - Code

Compliance, Tommy Cobb and Councilman Monroe. If you see problems existing within the Oakridge area please contact each of these and tell them your story. It is extremely critical that all residents within in the walls of Oakridge communicate problems to all three. Perhaps we will get a more immediate and effective response to compliance situations if we all are responsive. Have you called any of these numbers lately?

On March 24<sup>th</sup> the city Plan Commission will deal with the development of the 14+/- acres of land located at the Northwest corner of Shiloh and Buckingham Roads. The developer made a presentation to the ONA board at the March 6<sup>th</sup> general membership meeting. Thus far it appears that this development would be a fantastic addition to the Oakridge area. This development would have its own mandatory association. It would be good if several Oakridge folks could attend the March 24<sup>th</sup> meeting and voice their approval. It would take about one year from City Council approval to see houses being constructed.

Spring is a time for the regeneration of plants all around us. Are you doing your part in keeping your yard in top shape – one that shows that you are proud to live in the Oakridge area? We have a new "team "maintaining the commons of Oakridge. The ONA board would like to expand the beauty of our area but it takes more memberships to cause that to happen. Jupiter & Beltline -- Acme Brick "Blend 10" (Exception: some repaired areas)

Shiloh & Buckingham -- mostly U.S. Brick "Old Town"

(Exceptions: some repaired areas; and north end of Shiloh from Big Oaks is Acme "Blend 10")

The company below stocks small quantities of brick and should be able to give you a list of masonry contractors or you may look in the yellow pages under "mason Contractors":

# **CIP and Budget Updates**

Dear Friends and Neighbors of District 7:

First of all, I wanted to tell you that I received a new laptop computer, and my e-mail list went with my old one. I regularly send e-mail updates about occurrences in city government. If you would like to be added to or removed from my distribution list or know someone who wants to be added, please let me know.

Here is a brief overview of the City's capital improvement program (CIP) and some areas that may be of interest to you. Capital improvements are a planned investment in an infrastructure improvement in a municipal facility - in short, areas within particular departments, per se, that have the potential to expand. The 2003 CIP is aimed at making significant progress toward the completion of the 1997 bond program. The breakdown is as follows:

- Parks and Recreations Department 4 million +
- 2. Performing Arts Center 3.9 million (PAC completion scheduled to open in March.)
- 3. Street and Transportation 36.5 million, including the addition of a traffic light at the intersection of North Garland Road and Naaman Forest (specific site undetermined) due to the increased traffic in this area. I will continue to request a light at Shiloh and Homestead.)
- 4. Drainage 5.1 million
- 5. Library 1.9 million (including 2 library per capita goal)
- 6. Landfill 4.9 million
- 7. Public Safety 26.7 million (including new courts building, fire training facility, fire stations 10 & 11; Station 10 will be located in District 7 on Beltline and Sam Houston)
- 8. Facilities and Miscellaneous 7.4 million

All of these projects are debt funded. Other projects such as Firewheel Golf, Wastewater and Electric, etc. are revenue funded. I feel that they are a good step toward upgrading our city's infrastructure and adding overall improvements.

I recently received a report from our Budget and Research Department which states that if current economic trends continue, we will be facing another difficult budget year in 2004. I

want to share this information with you to give you a better understanding of the impact the city will face. Some of the revenues seeing a decrease in the General Fund are the ad valorem tax, sales tax, landfill revenues, municipal court, Emergency Medical Service, and investment income. Additionally, in Utilities, Electric is experiencing a decrease from the number reported last year. Group Health Insurance expenditures increased, and Firewheel Golf and the Hotel/Motel Tax revenues were down. There are, however, other areas that are offsetting some of these declines. A review of several economic indicators for Garland points to improvements but only a modest increase in the 2003 tax base. In addition, there are initial indicators that we may experience a decline in the 2004 property values. These will be tough times, but I know that with strong leadership, we will persevere.

We've recently seen some magazine salespeople in Oakridge. They come to your front door and ask you to let them show you what they have to offer. They want to get inside. They talk about getting "points" for selling magazines. These people may be fine individuals, however, this type of "pitch" is one similar to several "scams" being run throughout the country. We recommend that you **do not** open your door to them. Ask them politely to leave because you are not interested. If they do not leave, call 911!! On 3/1/03 C.O.P. called GPD to Oakridge because several "salesmen" were out here soliciting and making some residents feel uneasy because of their persistence.

A word of warning, the Garland Police Department is aware of the major problem we have with drivers running the stop signs at Moss and Diamond Oaks. Over 60% of drivers **do not stop** at this intersection. It's just a matter of time until someone gets hurt, or worse, at that intersection. When you get that "expensive" ticket don't say that you weren't warned! Don't forget, last year the GPD gave out "many" tickets to stop sign runners at Big Oaks and Laurel Oaks.

If you have an hour or two per week, we need your help patrolling Oakridge. All you need to do is go through a one day (Saturday) training session given by the Garland Police Department. After training, you will be ready to help us patrol Oakridge.

Several of our police officers as well as other city employees, are now on active duty "in harms way". The Oakridge Citizens Patrol wishes them a quick and safe return to our city. God speed "warriors"!!




