The City appreciates all community organizations that help in this regard. The ONA Board would appreciate it if all folks living in our community would spread the word that signs are not to be placed in / on City property. We thank you for your understanding and cooperation in keeping our neighborhood beautiful.

Soliciting:

It appears the number of "solicitors" working the Oakridge area has somewhat diminished, either because of the change in the weather or our continued monitoring of these individuals. It is our hope that this trend will continue. We generally call the Garland Police when a solicitor violates city ordinance by placing fliers at homes where a "no soliciting" sign is exhibited. This is usually the only time when we do ask for police assistance with solicitors because of the current city ordinance. We have been in contact with GPD and confirmed our position regarding when we should call for an officer to help regarding solicitors. Usually, when they see the C.O.P. vehicles they leave the area, so if you see someone leaving fliers at homes where no soliciting signs are displayed, please give us a call.

Stop Sign Violations

Motorcycle officers from the "traffic division" of the GPD recently gave out many tickets to Oakridge residents who thought that the stop signs on Diamond Oaks and Moss were really "slow down" signs. The officers spent several days in Oakridge between 3pm and 4pm watching for violators . BE AWARE, however, that just because they were there during those particular hours it doesn't mean they can't or won't be there or elsewhere in Oakridge, at other times.

Holiday Season:

We are about to start the fall/winter holiday season and because there is no December Newsletter, members of the C.O.P (Jim, Jim, Mark, Kathleen, Ken, Jane, Jerry, Bill, Bill, Paul, Brenda, June, & Donna) wish all a wonderful, safe holiday.

Remember, if you are going out of town, give us a call and we will try to keep an eye on your home while you're gone.

Now for some **"safety and security"** suggestions for the holiday season:

1. Make sure your lights have no damaged or loose wires to prevent fires or electrical shock. Toss any that may not be safe.

2. Never leave candles burning unattended. It only takes a second or two for a fire to begin dripping candle wax or for the flame to rise quickly or be blown into fabrics, etc. when a door is opened.

3. Don't overload your electrical circuits. A fire can develop in the wiring and be burning for sometime before you become aware of it. Most of our homes were built in the early '80's and the wiring is over 20 years old. If in doubt about the wiring, call a qualified, licensed electrician to check it out. Be safe, not sorry.

4. Be extra careful if you're climbing onto the roof of your home. All the roofs in Oakridge are sloped and it can be easy to slide right off.

5. When shopping- take only one or two credit cards with you. We strongly suggest that you don't put them in your purse (ladies); in fact, we suggest that you don't carry a purse at all. Either use a fanny pack, and put it in front, not on your hip or rear, or tuck your credit cards, driver's license, insurance/identification cards and a couple of dollars into a small cosmetic bag and slip it into your pocket (pants or skirt, or front pocket blouse or sweater). This makes it difficult for a pickpocket to get to and makes it impossible for purse snatchers and, if you lose it, you have only 2 cards to cancel and replace and driver's license to replace.

6. For Men: carry your wallet in your front pocket when shopping. Carry your money in one pocket in a clip and your wallet in the other. Don't put it in your hip pocket, even one that is button down. Believe it or not it is easy to lift it, even from a buttoned pocket, without you knowing it. If you're wearing a jacket, you can put it in an inside front pocket, but watch out for someone bumping into you head on and lifting it. This is a common ploy of pick pockets.

7. Always lock your car when you exit it to go into a shopping center or store. This is a simple precaution to prevent someone from getting into and hiding in your vehicle awaiting your return. Always look at your vehicle as you are approaching it-if you spot a broken win-

dow or other damage don't go to the vehicle, immediately return to the store/mall and call the police.

8. Before you leave a store or mall, make sure you have your keys in hand, ready to enter your vehicle-if you have a security lock on the car, have it ready to be used so that you don't have to stand outside the vehicle and fumble for your keys.

9. Go shopping, make some purchases and return to your car, secret the items in the trunk. If you're planning to shop in another area/store in the mall which isn't immediately accessible to your vehicle, get in and drive the vehicle to a different location. Never, ever, shop at multiple stores and load your arms and hands down so that you can not get your keys out, can't easily see where you're going and/or run if you need to.

10. Every one tries to be friendly during the holidays, but, don't take a stranger (man or woman) into your vehicle. If someone needs help, use your cell phone and call the police. Remember, it's only been a year or so since one of our friendly residents was killed by someone who grabbed her at a mall. I'm not telling you to be rude, but, your life is more important than being friendly!

11. Watch for anyone who may be following youeither when driving home or walking in the store/mall. As you exit a store/mall, look around you to make sure no one is watching you.

12. As a final suggestion-we all know it's sometimes hard to find your vehicle when you exit a mall or large store. Two things you can do to help remember where you're parked. A. When you park, write a note to yourself on a piece of paper and put it in your pocket (I use a sticky note so I don't accidentally drop it). You can refer to it when you're finished shopping or feel it's time to put things in the car. B. Buy yourself a large, colorful, artificial flower, use some hot glue around the bottom of the flower at the stem to make sure it won't come off easily and after that dries tape the stem onto your radio aerial using some electrical (black) tape or other strong, weatherproof type tape. This will enable you to see your car above all the others in the parking lot. If you can't see it or if you don't remember where you parked, flag down a mall security vehicle and describe your vehicle to the driver, they will help you find your vehicle safely-don't get into the car with anyone other than mall security and don't ask anyone other than mall security to help you find your car.

AS ALWAYS, THIS IS THE TIME OF YEAR WHEN WE GET SOME GRINCHES- SO ANYTHING THAT YOU PLACE OUTSIDE YOUR HOME FOR DECORA-TION SHOULD BE SECURED AGAINST THEFT AND VANDALISM.

Hopefully we have given you some suggestions you can use to help keep you safe and secure your belongings during this holiday season-without scaring you to death-that said-*HAPPY HOLIDAYS!*

Garden Corner By: Garden Lover

This is the time to plant bulbs for spring blossoms if you haven't done so already. If you're planting tulips, be sure to intersperse some daffodils with them to prevent the squirrels from eating your tulips (they don't like daffodils). You can also use some of the "paper skins" from daffodils and put them in with your tulip bulbs if you want to plant daffodils elsewhere in the yard. Always try to group the bulbs in clusters of five or more, this makes for a much prettier show, and, if the squirrels happen to grab one bulb, you'll still have a nice display. Another suggestion to help fend off the pesky little critters is to plant your tulip bulbs, then insert a pansy in the hole before you push in the soil. This helps, but won't completely discourage them if they're very hungry.

Now is also the time to prune hedges, roses and other plants back- by now you should have pruned your roses by at least 1/3, and before frost, a second 1/3 should be pruned. At the same time, put some food/insect repellent/killer like BAYERS ROSE CARE around your roses. This will not only feed them through the winter but also help take care of any insects, grubs, etc. so that spring comes you will have nice healthy plants. Mulch should be placed around all your plants to help keep the ground warmer but be careful not to place the mulch against the trunk of the plant to prevent fungus. You can also purchase a cold barrier cloth at your home center, it's flexible and allows water and air to circulate, but helps keep frost

bite or cold burn from affecting tender plants. It works well on roses-I even kept some petunias over the past two winters using this stuff. Obviously, some plants will need to be brought inside for the winter. Now is the time to prune them back (within reason) and reduce the amount of water you give them and no fertilizer. Before bringing them inside, take them out of their pots (or the ground), check the roots for insect or nematode damage, then repot them in fresh soil and water well (don't soak them, just make sure the soil is seated and air pockets don't exist. Take them inside immediately after repotting them to ensure that you don't bring insects (like ants and roaches) inside. I store my plants in my garage, it's not too cold because your vehicles put off some warmth (and carbon monoxide) when you drive in. I also installed a grow light so that they would have some light occasionally but I usually forget to put it on. I mist once a week and water very lightly about once every other a week. If the soil seems overly dry you can water more frequently, just don't make the soil "wet" or you will get fungus and mold. You don't want growth, just life. No fertilizer at this point. In late February or early March begin watering more frequently and include a light liquid fertilizer to encourage the plant to wake up. When it's warm enough, you can take the plant back outside!

Looking forward to seeing lots of beautiful flowers throughout Oakridge this spring-until then, enjoy the holidays and stay warm.
