Their good will has paid off -- the City says they'll be getting the jobs. I hope you'll check out their ads in the Oakridge News and give them your business, and refer your friends and family to them. Garland needs more businesses like this.

So, hopefully sooner than later, our signs will be lit up at our main entrances, we'll have beautiful uplights in the trees at the Jupiter/Ridge Oak entrance, our bridge will look clean and new, and your ONA dollars can help us start doing some landscaping along Buckingham with our new irrigation in place. Our new Station No. 11, located on Beltline and Sam Houston, was open and operating on December 19th just in time for them to see what a great neighborhood Oakridge is. Even though some of the guys from Station No. 3 (Jupiter @ Bobbie Lane) were transferred to the new station, they felt special that there was so much food made and money contributed to be able to include them in this special day. As always, Station No. 3 and No. 6 were very grateful for all the food delivered. Station No. 6 will not be servicing Oakridge since the new Station No. 11 will be taking over their territory. This makes me a little sad thinking ahead to next Christmas. I am not sure I will be able to drop them from this special gift. I guess I will deal with this problem in November. I believe we have been doing this for 8 years now.

This year there were some new neighbors that got involved and more money contributed so I did not have to depend on Albertson's to donate any food. In the past, Albertsons donations for iust 2 stations was about \$80 to \$100 and then the Country Club donates and cooks the meat dish with a couple of side dishes. This year with all the money contributed I was able to buy extra food for all three stations to have food for the remainder of the week and for the other shifts to enjoy also. I even have some money left over to start with next year. Hams, cakes, pretzels, popcorn, bags of apples, supplies of paper plates, napkins, cups and plastic ware were provided to all 3 stations and also 3 Passbooks for each station to share. Hello to all in Oakridge,

I hope everyone had a wonderful holiday season and is ready to take on the New Year.

I spent the week before New Years out of town, to come home to the heart wrenching news that there had been a fatal accident at Overview and Buckingham. As with all accidents of this nature, Buckingham had to be closed down for the investigation and traffic had to be rerouted. Unfortunately, the traffic was re-routed down Diamond Oaks and as most would agree, Oakridge is not the easiest to navigate. This in itself created another safety concern because the traffic not familiar with Oakridge was circling. I have asked the City Manger to look into a more effective way for the future if we should ever have a tragedy like this again. Thank you to all of those that tried to help guide the traffic out of Oakridge and know that our thoughts and prayers are with the family who lost their loved one.

Has anyone noticed the new florescent crosswalk signs throughout Garland? This is a direct result in civil penalties paid by those who have encountered the Red Light Cameras. You will also notice that all of our traffic signals will be changed to the L.E.D. lights, which are brighter and more visible. There will also be new crosswalk timers placed throughout the city at busy intersections. The City Council has directed the staff to use the money collected from red light runners to fund traffic safety programs.

The City Council is currently in review of the Capital Improvements Program (CIP) and should have something finalized by February. Highlights are new roadways around Firewheel Town Center and infrastructure needs for the Harbor Point project. Also included in the CIP are playground equipment improvements throughout the city as well as money for the Library. Deck of Cards author unknown

It was quiet that day, the guns and the mortars, and land mines for some reason hadn't been heard. The young soldier knew it was Sunday, the holiest day of the week. As he was sitting there, he got out an old deck of cards and laid them out across his bunk. Just then an army sergeant came in and said, "Why aren't you with the rest of the platoon?" The soldier replied, "I thought I would stay behind and spend some time with the Lord." The sergeant said, "Looks to me like you're going to play cards." The soldier said, "No sir, you see, since we are not allowed to have Bibles or other spiritual books in this country, I've decided to talk to the Lord by studying this deck of cards." The sergeant asked in disbelief, "How will you do that?"

"You see the **Ace**, Sergeant? It reminds me that there is only **one** God. The **Two** represents the two parts of the Bible, Old and New Testaments. The **Three** represents the Father, Son, and the Holy Ghost. The **Four** stands for the Four Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. The **Five** is for the five virgins that were ten but only five of them were glorified. The **Six** is for the six days it took God to create the Heavens and Earth. The **Seven** is for the day God rested after making His Creation. The **Eight** is for the family of Noah and his wife, their three sons and their wives - the eight people God spared from the flood that destroyed the Earth. The **Nine** is for the lepers that Jesus cleansed of leprosy. He cleansed ten, but nine never thanked Him. The **Ten** represents the Ten Commandments that God handed down to Moses on tablets made of stone. The **Jack** is a reminder of Satan, one of God's first angels, but he got kicked out of heaven for his sly and wicked ways and is now the joker of eternal hell. The **Queen** stands for the Virgin Mary. The **King** stands for Jesus, for he is the King of all kings.

When I count the dots on all the cards, I come up with 365 total, one for every day of the year. There are a total of **52 cards in a deck**; each is a week - 52 weeks in a year. The **four suits** represent the four seasons: Spring, Summer, Fall and Winter. Each **suit has thirteen cards** - there are exactly thirteen weeks in a quarter. So when I want to talk to God and thank Him, I just pull out this old deck of cards and they remind me of all that I have to be thankful for."

The sergeant just stood there. After a minute, with tears in his eyes and pain in his heart, he said, "Soldier, can I borrow that deck of cards?"
