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District 7 Council Report

In last month's article, I sought feedback on the issue of when bulky items should be put at the front curb for pick up, and I appreciate hearing from several constituents. Council is still in the process of tweaking that ordinance, and we are discussing the always controversial issue of where to store those green containers after pick up for houses that do not have alley pick up. Currently, the law says they should be placed "...next to the side of the main dwelling unit or in a location out of the view of public or adjacent property." Since residents can put their green container "next to the side" of their house, many are still very visible from the front street. Some citizens have suggested that they should be rolled into the backyard unless there is no backyard access from the front curb, and only then should they be placed "...next to the side of the

main dwelling unit or in a location out of the view of public or adjacent property." Got an opinion on this? Let me know.

Speaking of green containers, some of you might recall that last July, we increased the residential solid waste pick up rate by \$1.84 due to the sky high price of fuel. Since the price has now dropped considerably, we recently voted to decrease the monthly cost of solid waste pick up by \$0.76 to \$17.33. We also decreased commercial rates by 6%.

What had always frustrated me in trying to find an old council meeting to review what the inability to search. Now there is, and it works! I tried it.

For an appetizer we ordered the Shrimp Fondue, which we thought was excellent. The four of us enjoyed the food, and rated our dinners as very good. 

Hi Neighbors, Hopefully you are enjoying our great spring weather.

Residential : ENERGY-SAVING TOOLS : 2009 ENERGY TAX INCENTIVES

The household maximum tax credit amount is \$1,500. There are tax credits available in the following areas: Insulation, Windows, Skylights, Exterior Door, Duct Sealing and Air Infiltration reduction (this is a fancy description for an air leak). We all have air leaks, also there is credit available for asphalt roofs with cooling granules, which meets or exceeds Energy Star requirements. Yes, central air conditioner, natural gas furnace, natural gas water heater, and solar power generation are available for the tax credit. Improvements and systems must be placed in service between 1/1/2009 and 12/31/2010. Equipment and materials must be new when installed at the taxpayer's home. The manufacturer should provide a certification statement on packaging, website, or in another manner suitable for taxpayer recordkeeping. It is important to note that not all Energy Star-certified products will qualify under these new regulations.

also just learned that the City will be replacing some failed concrete pavement areas in Richoak Drive between Shiloh Road and Sam Houston Drive. That project is scheduled for this summer so that it will not affect traffic to and from local schools.

One of the most common complaints I receive is street light outages. About 85% of Garland is service by GP&L and the other 15% is serviced by Oncor. You can report an Oncor street light outage via the Internet or phone. Doing it by phone is a slow hassle, so using the Internet is preferable. After reporting via Internet <u>http://</u> www.txuelectricdelivery.com/community/streetlights/ form.aspx., you receive a confirming automated phone message from Oncor saying it will be fixed within 15 days.

For GP&L outages, both phone and Internet reporting are fast and easy. The phone number to call is 972-205-3483. Report via the Internet with this link:

http://www.garlandpower-light.org/electeither.html. If in doubt about whose light it is, contact GP&L. If it is not their light, they will contact Oncor. This is just another example of the helpful service provided by the City of Garland.

Looking for a job? I attended the Early Local Census Office (ELCO) opening in Plano on February 4 and was given a tour of the office. That office has oversight for 30 counties, and currently they are processing job application. Census jobs pay from \$11.75/hr. to \$16.50/hr. plus mileage reimbursement. They need about 900 such employees in the 30 county area. You can find much more information at <u>www.2010censusjobs.com</u>. The official census day is April 1, 2010.

On February 24, Mayor Jones, Council representatives Cox, Willis, and I met for about one hour with two employees of the *Dallas Morning News* (*DMN*) regarding the problem of the *Briefing* newspaper cluttering up Garland Neighborhoods. Recently, the DMN has reduced the number of *Briefing* newspapers being delivered in Garland by about 50%, and their goal is to deliver only to homes that desire to receive this little publication. I was favorably impressed by the attitude of DMN representatives, and it seems the ordinance Garland passed to require unsolicited papers to be thrown within 5' of the front door got their attention.

Since I'm a lover of flowers and plants, my favorite time of the year is about to arrive—Spring. When I was obtaining my Ornamental Horticulture degree from Richland College, one of my favorite teachers was Karen Forbes who now teaches at Naaman Forest High School.
