"Your neighborhood influences your home value" This opening statement should be of great importance to every homeowner living in our Oakridge community. Why? Owning your home is one of the biggest investments you will make - a phrase often repeated by financial "experts". In a few months it will be time to "spruce up" the outside appearance of your home. This is good. But as potential home buyers enter your community what do you think goes through their mind as they approach your Oakridge neighborhood? What they see is a worn out looking landscaped attempt at creating an inviting neighborhood. You can help in changing that worn out looking entrance by joining the Oakridge Neighborhood Association – or by continuing your membership in the coming years. Thank you.

This past November the citizens of Garland approved an increase in the tax rate of \$0.02 per hundred valuation strictly earmarked for street repair. Our city council appointed a nine member citizen's committee to assist in evaluating the street needs of all of Garland. Oakridge is fortunate that one of our homeowners was appointed to serve on that committee.

District 7 City Council Scott LeMay

There were two agenda items discussed at length in our Feb 3rd work session. One was the final disposition of the Pace and Lyles houses and the other was the renewal and amendment of the transportation consultant agreement with Dean International.

As far as the Pace and Lyles houses are concerned, there is a proposal currently under review that would remove both from city ownership and future care. The Pace house would go to a private investor and the house would be restored to livable conditions in an "historic" neighborhood setting within the city. The Lyles house would go to a group focused on "historical preservation" within the city as well. This would be similar to the Landmark Society that maintains the train car and depot that have been relocated behind the Main Library downtown. The details of this proposal will come back to council for review.

In May 2013 Dean International was retained by a one year contract to be our transportation consultants. Dean International will work with us on our behalf to lobby for state transportation related funding on the major highways that border or cross the city. To date some progress has been made on this effort with a sound wall being approved for a section of IH- 635 that is adjacent to homes along there.

The amended contract we have been presented after review by our Council Transportation Committee includes not only a 21 month extension of the contract but also an increase in monthly cost and overall scope. The current contract has a monthly fee of \$20,000 for the services listed above. The new contract has a proposed increase in that monthly fee to \$30,000. The reason behind this increase is to cover additional scope items that include-

DART Focus "Assist in the creation of policy objectives to better manage its \$23M annual investment."

Garland Industrial Focus "A assist in identifying and creating policy provisions for the industrial area."

Advocacy Group "Bring together and educate stakeholders to forward the City's transportation projects and initiatives."

We voted to delay the vote on this until March 4th. Please review this discussion:




Daytimers by Diane Winter
