This will begin to sound like a broken record – but here it and sorely needed improvements await. Your ONA Board goes. What is terribly wrong with this picture: there are has a target of 500 members and with that number much 1,166 homes in YOUR Oakridge community and of that can be accomplished to improve the appearance of the number there are 297 homes that have previously been a community landscaping. Will you do your part and become member of the Oakridge Neighborhood Association (ONA) but are not presently members! And these folks are still in every home late this August. The Board apologizes to living in their Oakridge Community! One must wonder why those who have joined but it has proven to be much more these 297 residences thought it important to support the cost-effective to invoice this way than to individually mail to philosophy of this statement - "The value of your home is reflected in the appearance of your neighborhood" and now totally ignore that statement. It belies belief and certainly defies why being involved (even if only just a member of the ONA) once and now snubbing the community they still call home. City of Garland District 7 Report—Scott LeMay

Council Updates-

In November 2013 Garland voters approved a 2 cent tax increase to raise additional funds dedicated solely to street and alley repair and replacement. Just to clarify this tax increase was not immediate to the voter approval and was not to be enacted until the fall of 2014 with the 2014-2015 city budget. This item came up after our budget considerations last year so it was not considered as a part of that but was discussed and the methods were reviewed. To further study this item the Mayor created an Ad Hoc Streets Improvement Committee with each councilmember appointing one person to serve. I was proud to appoint your Oakridge neighbor Keith Engler. This very dedicated group and staff met every Thursday evening through the spring. During that time they reviewed the financial challenges and the best methods for street repair. They presented their final report to the council at the end of June and we have by consensus vote approved their recommendations on practices and are still considering their recommendation of financing. Prior to the voter approval of the 2 cent tax increase the council also considered establishing a user fee instead. The exact amount of that fee was never determined. The committee has recommended not only that we follow through with the tax increase but also supplement that with a monthly user fee of \$4.00. As with any decision there are advantages and disadvantages. Considerable

thought must be given to the financial impacts on the city as well as the citizens. As you can imagine the council will give this all the due diligence it requires and your input will be greatly appreciated. We know we need to improve our streets but at the same time control expenses both short and long term.

Around The District-

Progress is continuing on the new charter high school as well as the new bank at the corner of Arapaho and Shiloh. I have spoken with the owner of the remaining property and he is actively working on finding buyers to continue the development in the area. You may have also noticed all the dirt being moved around at the Chamber Brothers property along Arapaho. There is no new development on this property planned at the moment. What you are seeing is the process of filling in the guarries that have been active on that land for decades. While not overly attractive it is a necessary part of a very long process to reclaim what has been removed.

No numbers are presented this month as we are early into the year, and any kind of analysis is, thus, not very meaningful now. We are focused on getting members for this fiscal year (June 01, 2014 through May 31, 2015), and we need you to be a part of the ONA this year! District Directors and volunteers will be making courtesy calls to ask you, as our fellow neighbors, to join us as members. We have all but abandoned the "house address specific" invoice mailings to just non-members because the dollar cost plus the cost of time for volunteers to do the work just far exceeds the cost to send the new special edition membership invoicing to all Oakridge residents. CONFUSION!!!

There has long been confusion here in Oakridge as to who has to (a) fix damages to the perimeter walls, (b) maintain trees that are planted inside of those walls that droop over those walls, and (c) upkeep the alleys inside those perimeter walls. Per the City of Garland Planning Department, the developer of Oakridge constructed the screening walls "on private property which would make maintenance and/or replacement cost of the screening wall the responsibility of the property owner for the portion of the screening wall constructed on the homeowner's lot. After examining the various plats for this subdivision, there is an alley easement at the rear of the lot with the wall being constructed in the alley easement. The alley easement is on the homeowner's private property." Any wall or alley repairs, City trimming of trees growing in the alley easement area, and so on are the responsibility of the homeowners to pay. These homeowners must pay from their homeowner's insurance proceeds and/or personal funds. The ONA will help (where possible) the homeowner with the sourcing of repair materials so as to keep the wall repairs looking like a patchwork quilt.

Duck Creek Golf Update—Mike Ussery

It has been great to get some welcome summer rainfall and less than totally scorching temperatures. The golf course turfgrass, which was planted last summer, continues to mature and is now filling in around the areas where winter overseed is now gone. We are extremely pleased with the condition of our greens which are now some of the best in the area.

Over the next few weeks we will be adding a few areas of new sod to take care of spots that have not yet covered. We expect to see our best conditions yet by around September 1. As most of you are aware, the golf course is irrigated with water from Duck Creek which we then replace through pumpage from our underground well. Over the course of a year, we replenish all water used from the creek with water from the well. Thus the golf course does not use potable water and as such is not subject to City of Garland watering restrictions.

We hope you have had a chance to get out on the course. In addition to daily fee rates we offer attractive annual membership programs and golf instruction. The Duck Creek Grill serves a menu of sandwiches and snacks as well as an assortment of canned and draft beers. Support from our Oakridge neighbors is especially appreciated.

ONA General Membership Meeting Minutes—July 2014

At the July 24, 2014 Board of Directors meeting, there was considerable discussion on efforts to increase membership. We have returned to using Membership flags (bright orange this time). These will be displayed at the homes of members of the ONA. District Directors are reaching out to former members, in the hope that they will renew their membership. We also have a new program, merchant cards for ONA member households. These cards may be used at local vendors for discounts or additional services.

We are installing a pilot/test drip irrigation retrofit at the Ridge Oak and Jupiter entrance. The system will be evaluated for effectiveness in keeping plantings healthy, but minimizing the cost of water.
