Baylor Garland Hospital to Close February 28

After 53 years, Baylor Garland Hospital, once among the largest in northeast Dallas, will close February 28 because of care centers, 48 ambulatory surgery centers, 21 hospitals and declining inpatient numbers.

The staff will continue serving admitted patients until Feb- land facility. ruary 28th; then they will either be discharged or transferred to ruary 16th.

The closure will affect 711 employees; some are being transferred to other Baylor facilities.

Remainder of Oakridge to Receive Blue Recycle Carts

After delays in manufacturing due to Hurricane Harvey, the city of Garland will start the delivery of blue recycling carts. Oakridge is in a blue schedule zone which means the carts will be delivered January 23 through January 26.

This is the final phase of replacing red recycling bins with blue carts. During Phase 6, approximately 9,900 residents will be added to the program and will receive new blue recycling receptacles.

Oakridge residents who currently use their red recycling bins may keep them, return them to the EWS Recycling Center, 1426 Commerce St., or place them inside their new blue recycling carts to be recycled. Once the blue carts are delivered, the red bins will no longer be serviced.

Recycling will continue to be collected on the same schedule, with pickup occurring once every other week based on zone. Trash pickup will continue to be collected once per week.

A cart-care packet will be placed on the lid of each cart, containing a recycling poster, service dates and an activities page for kids.

Financial Services Manager and Recycling Cart Project Manager Tyra Lewis said, "EWS is thrilled to provide all of our residents with blue recycling carts. Residents can place cardboard, mixed paper, aluminum, plastics, and glass bottles and jars in the cart together."

Garland Environmental Waste Services reminds you to follow the following guidelines to better facilitate recyclables collection:

- Set bin(s) at the collection point by 7 A.M. on your designated collection day.
- Place the bin four feet from your green trash container, so the trucks can easily pick up each container.
- Do not place containers near mailboxes, electrical or cable boxes, or other stationary objects such as a gas or water meter.
- Wth the new blue carts, you may place all of your recyclable materials in the cart without sorting.




