

Oakridge Recipe Corner

I am starting a new section in the newsletter and I would like you to help become a part! This is a space to share your favorite recipes with the rest of the neighborhood. We have a great diversity of cultures in Oakridge, so I hope you will share some of your family's traditional favorite dishes with the rest of us to enjoy. This was a favorite of mine that my mom used to make for our family all the time. Growing up in Corpus Christi, we were only 45 minutes from the famous King Ranch—the largest ranch in Texas with over 825,000 acres. Also my high school-King High School-was named for Captian Richard King, who began acquiring land for the Ranch in 1853.

KING RANCH CHICKEN

- 1 (10 3/4-ounce) can cream of chicken soup
- 1 (10 3/4-ounce) can cream of mushroom soup
- 1 cup chicken broth
- 1 (10-ounce) can of Ro-Tel tomatoes
- 1 teaspoon garlic salt

Cooking spray

- 12 (8-inch) corn tortillas cut into quarters
- 1 (3-pound) roasted chicken, boned and shredded
- 1 medium onion, diced
- 2 cups store-bought grated Mexican-blend cheese (8 ounces)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit.

In a large saucepan set over medium-high heat, combine the cream of chicken soup, cream of mushroom soup, chicken broth, tomatoes and garlic salt. Stir until warm, about 5 minutes. Remove from the heat and set aside.

Grease a 9-by-13-inch baking dish with cooking spray. Put half of the tortillas in the bottom of the pan, layering half each of the chicken and onion, then sprinkle with one-third of the cheese mix. Pour half of the soup mixture over the top, and then repeat the layers. Top the casserole with the remaining third of the cheese.

Bake for 45 minutes or until the cheese has melted and browned slightly.
