ONA Annual Meeting

Video Crime Watch

In our April newsletter, we let you know about the Video Crime Watch Program recently launched by the Garland Police Department. This strictly voluntary program helps GPD more quickly identify cameras that may have captured footage in the area where a crime occurred. (The program does not provide police direct access to any surveillance system.) If the police believe footage from your camera may be helpful, they will contact you using the contact information you provide.


We would love to have all our Oakridge residents with surveillance cameras add their information to the Garland Video Crime Watch map. To add your camera(s) to the map, go to the GPD website (www.garlandpolice. com/331/Police) then scroll down to the "Garland Crime Watch Video" section.

As of this week, there are 25 Oakridge participants in the Garland Video Crime Watch program. If we have enough people add their cameras to the map, we will receive a plaque to hang beneath our Crime Watch signs throughout the neighborhood, indicating we are a Video Crime Watch neighborhood. This visible statement of our level of security would be a big deterrent to criminals looking to target our neighborhood.




As we enter the warmer months of the year, be mindful of the City of Garland's water conservation plan. Watering restrictions in place between April 1st and October 31st include:

- Residents may water twice each week if using an inground sprinkler system. (Watering between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. is prohibited.)
- When using hand-held devices, soaker hoses, or drip irrigation, residents may water any time on any day as long as excessive runoff does not occur.
