Are you new to the neighborhood? Welcome!

Have you heard about the Oakridge Neighborhood Association (ONA) yet? In 1992, Oakridge residents formed the ONA as a way to stay connected about crime and safety issues, promote neighborliness in the community, and maintain the entryways and grass around the perimeter of the neighborhood.

Twenty-eight years after its establishment, the ONA volunteers continue to dutifully care for the entryway landscaping, provide regular crime and safety updates through the Siren Alert emails and on the website, distribute an informative newsletter, and coordinate social events (when social distancing restrictions are not in place).

One of the lesser-known services of the ONA is providing welcome bags for new residents. These bags, which display the City of Garland logo, typically contain several items from the City of Garland such as brochures, refrigerator magnets, and other promotional items. They also contain a brochure about the ONA as well as a recent Oakridge newsletter and a membership application.

It can be quite a challenge figuring out who is new to the neighborhood, which means we sometimes miss our chance to welcome our newest neighbors. क्या आप पड़ोस में नए हैं? आपका स्वागत है!

क्या आपने ओक्रीज नेबरहुड एसोसिएशन (ONA) के बारे में सुना है? 1992 में ओक्रीज निवासियों ने अपराध और सुरक्षा के मुद्दों से जुड़े रहने, समुदाय में पड़ोस को बढ़ावा देने और पड़ोस की परिधि के आसपास प्रवेश मार्ग और घास को बनाए रखने के लिए ONA का गठन किया।

अपनी स्थापना के अट्ठाईस साल बाद, ONA स्वयंसेवक एंट्रीवे लैंडस्केपिंग की देखभाल करना जारी रखते हैं, सायरन अलर्ट ईमेल के माध्यम से नियमित अपराध और सुरक्षा अपडेट प्रदान करते हैं और वेबसाइट पर, एक सूचनात्मक समाचार पत्र वितरित करते हैं, और सामाजिक घटनाओं का समन्वय करते हैं (जब सामाजिक प्रतिबंध समाप्त हो गए होंगे)।

ONA की सेवाओं में से एक, नए निवासियों के लिए स्वागत बैग का उपहार है। सिटी ऑफ गारलैंड लोगो वाले इन बैग्स में आमतौर पर गारलैंड शहर के कई आइटम होते हैं जैसे ब्रोशर, रेफ्रिजरेटर मैग्नेट और अन्य प्रचारक आइटम। इस बैग में एक ONA ब्रोशर, वर्तमान ओक्रिज न्यूज़लेटर और एक सदस्यता आवेदन भी है।

Parking Regulations

The City Marshals are the officers who go out and issue tickets for parking violations. You may have noticed a bit more leniency during the pandemic, but this does not mean enforcement has dropped to zero. The City Marshals are still issuing tickets.

If you have a ticket to pay or you just need to brush up on the City parking laws, visit: <u>https://www.garlandtx.gov/3668/Neighborhood-Parking-Enforcement</u>.

Here are a few parking laws you may not be aware of:

- It is illegal to park within 15 feet of a fire hydrant.
- It is illegal to park within 20 feet of a crosswalk.
- It is illegal to park within 30 feet of an intersection control device (flashing sign, stop sign, etc.).
- It is illegal for the right-hand wheels of the vehicle to be more than 18" from the curb (which means you cannot park against the flow of traffic on a street).

Have you added your surveillance camera to the Garland Video Crime Watch Program yet? If enough Oakridge residents join the program, we will receive plaques to display beneath Crime Watch signs throughout the neighborhood, officially declaring we are a Video Crime Watch neighborhood.

This program:

- 1. is strictly voluntary.
- does NOT provide police direct access to any surveillance system.
- helps GPD more quickly identify cameras that may have captured footage in the area where a crime occurred. (If the police believe footage from your camera may be helpful, they will contact you using the contact information you provide.)
