
A Personal Note on Diversity

Bulky Trash Trucks

The bulky trash (also called brush and bulky goods or waste) collection day is Tuesday. So why have we been seeing bulky trash trucks on both Monday and Tuesday? Has our bulky trash day changed? No, the bulky trash day has not changed. *Bulky trash collection is still on Tuesday.* As for the trucks you see driving around on Mondays, City Councilman Dylan Hedrick helped us get to the bottom of that mystery.

Apparently, the citizens of Garland are producing more bulky trash this season (an increase of almost 7,000 tons so far this year). In order to stay on top of the increase, and to improve overall efficiency, the EWS (Environmental Waste Services) crews are starting their collections on Monday and finishing on Tuesday. They are testing this new approach to see if it is effective in keeping up with the increased tonnage, while reducing overtime expenses. As for the rest of us, we should continue putting our bulky trash out on Tuesday as always.

Thank you to the EWS crews for working hard in this heat to keep our streets clean!

Parking & Code Violations

In the last few months, the City of Garland has shown leniency in issuing notices for Code Violations and tickets for Parking Violations. However, that grace period has come to an end. You may want to take a quick look around your property for code violations. Here are 3 common violations:

- Tree limbs and shrubs in the alley must be trimmed so they do not extend more than one foot from the fence and up to 14 feet high from the ground.
- It is unlawful to allow a fence to lean more than 10 degrees or to have missing, loose, or broken slats or panels.
- Twelve inches is the height limit for grass and/or weeds.
