Spring Safety Tips

Spring and warmer weather are on the way which means more people will be outside doing yard work or simply enjoying the spring weather. Unfortunately criminals are also out and about. The best way a community can stay safe is having neighbors that look out for each other. Here are some tips from the Garland Police for keeping yourself and your neighbors safe.

- Lock your cars to help deter thieves who are looking for an easy target.
- Remove valuables from your car including keys (such as your car keys!), purses, shopping bags, guns, electronics, money, medicine, and jewelry.
- Close garage doors especially when you are working in the yard or just stepping inside. Open garages are an easy target for thieves.
- Pick up mail in a timely manner. Consider going to the Post Office to mail checks or set up automatic payments. Thieves are looking for packages, checks, or identity information left in mailboxes overnight; they keep the valuable information and throw the junk in the street (a felony if caught).
- Complete a Vacation Watch Request (free for Garland residents). If you plan to be out of town, consider having Volunteers in Policing check your home while you are gone. Visit the Garland Police website to complete a Vacation Watch Request form (www.garlandpolice.com/640/Volunteers-in-Policing).
- Consider getting a video doorbell (like Nest or Ring).
 These can be a good deterrent for porch pirates and can aid police in catching criminals (even if the video is blurry). Visit www.garlandpolice.com/331/Police to add your video doorbell to the Garland Video Crime

Spring Safety Tips by Joan Nichols

Watch map.

- Report suspicious activity. If you see suspicious activity or something (or somebody) that seems out of place, call the non-emergency number at 972-485-4840 (call 911 for emergency or crime in progress). Remember to include details that go beyond race and gender such as behavior, vehicle description, location, time of day, hair, clothing, identifying marks, etc. Share any security camera video that may be helpful with Officer Barnes at BarnesT@garlandtx.gov.
- **Discourage Porch Pirates** with the following:
 - Track deliveries online and quickly retrieve packages from your porch as soon as they are delivered.
 - Have packages delivered to your office building or a remote pickup site. Amazon has several hub lockers around the city. FedEx and UPS also offer similar options.
 - 3. Ask your neighbor to collect packages from your porch when you are away from home.
 - 4. Get a video doorbell (such as Nest or Ring). They may not always stop a Porch Pirate in their tracks, but they can help police identify them later.
