
The Challenge Continues!

Video Crime Watch Program

We are pleased to announce that Oakridge has been nominated as the first "Video Crime Watch"

neighborhood in Garland. We were selected based on the current video coverage (the number of residents participating in the Video Crime Watch Program) and our organized Crime Watch program. Be on the lookout for new signs to go under our Crime Watch signs at each entrance and a communication campaign featuring us on GPD social media.



How do I sign-up and what is involved?

[Please note, the system is strictly voluntary and cannot provide direct access to any surveillance system.]

Sign-up is simple. Anyone with video doorbells or any surveillance system can sign up. Visit the GPD website (http://www.garlandpolice.com/331/Police) then scroll down to the Garland Video Crime Watch Program. Information requested via the online form for any resident includes:

- street address
- primary contact (last, first name)
- primary phone # (best number to reach you)
- email
- video storage (cloud, local, both or unknown)

Once completed, double-check the pin map to ensure an accurate location and hit "submit".

If a crime occurs near your area, an investigator may privately email or call you using the contact information provided and ask you to review your camera footage for suspicious vehicle(s) or person(s) during a specific time. Your participation in this program helps to quickly identify and recover critical video related to criminal investigations and deter crime in our community.

Thanks to all who have already signed up! We need your help to identify willing neighbors with cameras in underrepresented areas and those at intersecting streets or entrances. Look for more communication as we reach out in the coming weeks.



Emergency Medical Form

Do you have a list of your medications, medical history, and allergies readily available? In an emergency, this is important information which the first responders need to know.

The Garland Fire Department has created such a list for you. Please print it, complete it, place it in a baggie and tape it to your refrigerator door. If you are always on-thego, place one in your purse or wallet. This information could help save your life.

Warning Sirens

Many people call them "Tornado Sirens", however that name is misleading since the sirens can be activited for a number of reasons.

According to the City of Garland, these Outdoor Warning Sirens (as they are officially called) can be activated for:

- Chemical spill emergency
- Other emergencies as appropriate
- Reports or suspected hail larger than 1.75 inches
- State or national emergency declared by the governor or president
- Sustained winds in excess of 70 miles per hour
- Tornado or funnel cloud reported by a reliable source
- A tornado warning issued by the National Weather Service

Also (as is suggested by their name) these sirens are designed to alert individuals who are *outdoors*, alerting them to find shelter. Sirens are not intended to alert people who are in cars, homes, or other buildings.

The sirens are tested on the first Wednesday of the month. Testing only occurs when weather conditions are clear.
