When watering your lawn or landscape, remember:

- No outdoor irrigation between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. to prevent excessive evaporation
- Watering with a hand-held hose using an automatic shutoff nozzle, soaker hose or drip irrigation is allowed at any time.

Don't Mess with Texas

If you lived in Texas in the 1980s, then you may remember the launch of the "Don't Mess with Texas" campaign to target littering. That campaign is still going strong and they have a website (<u>www.dontmesswithtexas.org</u>) with loads of information. Here are a few of their Litter Facts:

- You can be fined \$500 every time you litter in Texas. And, if what you toss weighs more than five pounds, you may have to pay up to \$2,000.
- Litter is trash that is not disposed of properly in a trash can. Apple cores and banana peels are litter too.




- Texans, ages 16 to 34, are those most likely to litter.
- 71% of litter consists of micro litter (two inches or smaller) such as cigarette butts, straws and gum wrappers.
- Cigarette butts make up the largest portion of micro litter in Texas.
- Items discarded from cars and trucks account for half of all litter along Texas roads.

Littering isn't just unsightly, it's *illegal* in Texas. Any law enforcement officer in Texas can enforce the litter laws.

Let's keep Texas clean, y'all!

iNaturalist Nature App

There's a wonderful tool that can enhance your walk through nature, whether you're strolling along Duck Creek or taking a hike in the Spring Creek Forest Preserve. The best part is that *it's FREE!*



With the iNaturalist app, you can have help identifying that strange bug you just encountered or the plant you have never seen before.

iNaturalist is a citizen science project and online social network of naturalists, citizen scientists, and biologists. This app is built on the concept of mapping and sharing observations of biodiversity across the globe and may be accessed via its website or from its mobile application.

Go online (<u>www.inaturalist.org</u>) or download the app, load up photos of creatures or plants or insects you encounter on your daily walks, and let this dedicated group of citizens help identify what you've seen!

Summer Safety Tips

Warmer Weather and summer vacations are upon us! Did you know that the Garland Police Department has a Vacation Watch program?

Vacation Watch

Uniformed volunteers in a marked Garland Police car check the homes of Garland citizens who are away from home on vacation to ensure that no burglar has broken in and taken their possessions. If you would like to have your home placed on the Vacation Watch list, please download the Vacation Watch Request Form which is available on the Garland Police Department website (<u>www.garlandtx.gov/331/Police</u>). This service is available to any homeowner within the city limits of Garland.

Crime Watch Opportunities

Citizens on Patrol (COP). Join our fleet of volunteer Citizens on Patrol (COP). We are the ones patrolling at various times during the day and night throughout Oakridge to help keep our neighborhood safe. Sign up now for the next class which will be hosted by the Garland Police Department



on Tuesday, July 20th, from 6 p.m. to 10 p.m. To be considered, complete the background check available on the GPD website at <u>www.garlandpolice.com/gov/lq/</u> <u>safety/police/cop.asp</u>. If cruising the neighborhood is not your thing, there are other ways to be involved with Crime Watch. We are all the eyes and ears of Oakridge. Feel free to contact <u>safety@oakridgena.org</u> to get involved.

Video doorbells like Ring can be a good deterrent and can aid police in catching criminals (even if the video is blurry). Add your doorbell camera to the Garland Video Crime Watch map by going to <u>www.garlandtx.gov/331/</u> <u>Police</u> (scroll down the page to the "Garland Video Crime Watch" section).

Report suspicious activity. If you see suspicious activity or something (or somebody) that seems out of place, call the non-emergency number at 972-485-4840 (or call 911 for emergency or crime in progress). Remember to include details that go beyond race and gender such as behavior, vehicle description, location, time of day, hair, clothing, identifying marks, etc. Share any security camera video that may be helpful with Officer Barnes at <u>BarnesT@garlandtx.gov</u>.
