City Councilman Update

Hard to believe that the summer is coming to a close and children are already back in school.

August also means that we are well into our "Budget Season" on City Council. This is the time of year where the City Manager presents the proposed city budget for the 2021-2022 fiscal year.

The previous year, the approved budget was very conservative given all the unknowns presented by the pandemic. Fortunately for the city, sales tax revenue—the city's second largest source of revenue—is projected to increase by 16.6% or \$4.8 million from last year and the certified property tax base—from which property tax is derived—reached \$18.4 billion in valuation or an increase of 7.5% year over year. This means that we are able to increase the city budget to provide more services to the citizens of Garland, fill some key positions within the city staff, and restore employee merit and compensation increases to remain competitive in the job market.

The proposed budget includes four public safety positions-three new fire fighters and a police mental health clinician to provide resilience training for police personnel and assist officers in identifying mental health resources when they interact with our homeless population. Compensation increases are proposed for 9-1-1 Dispatch Operators and two new positions to support the new animal shelter-an Adoption Specialist and a Veterinarian Technician-are included in the budget.

With over \$117 million going towards Parks and Recreation projects as part of the 2019 Bond Program, an Aquatics Technician position is proposed to maintain the numerous new splash parks to be built around the city. Funds will also be used for various landscape and ball field maintenance projects to keep our fields in top



playing shape. Workout equipment at the recreation centers is proposed to be replaced and Big Art Day received more funding after last year's successful event.

A fee and cost of service study study was completed this year and various fees for permits and services will be increasing throughout the city to better recover the costs of providing those services, however fees will remain inline with our neighboring cities across the Metroplex. There will be no increases to electric, water or stormwater rates, but there will be a \$1.00 increase to sewer and trash collection rates.

We held an all day work session August 14 to discuss the city budget, and will be holding several additional public hearings as required by state law. All budget documents are located on the city's website at <u>http:// www.garlandtx.gov/3528/Annual-Budget-Documents</u>. 
