Video Crime Watch Signs

Check out our new Video Crime Watch signs at the entrances. Oakridge was officially recognized by Garland Police as the first Video Crime Watch neighborhood in Garland. We offer a big "Thank You" to those who have already signed up with the program. Your participation helps to quickly identify and recover critical video related to criminal investigations and deter crime in our community.

Anyone with video doorbells or any surveillance system can sign up with the Video Crime Watch Program.

Please note, the system is strictly voluntary and cannot provide direct access to any surveillance system.

How do I sign-up and what is involved?

- Complete a short survey. The link to the survey is available through the GPD website. Visit http://www.garlandpolice.com/331/Police then scroll down to the Garland Video Crime Watch Program. Information requested via the online form for any resident includes: street address, primary contact (last, first name), primary phone # (best number to reach you), email, and video storage (cloud, local, both, or unknown).
- Once you fill in the requested information, be sure to double-check the pin map to ensure an accurate location and click "submit".

What happens after I sign up?

If a crime occurs near your area, an investigator may privately email or call you using the contact information provided and ask you to review your camera footage for suspicious vehicle(s) or person(s) during a specific time.

City Councilman Update

I hope you are enjoying the cooler weather as we move into fall. I certainly enjoyed the nice weather during Oakridge's National Night Out event on October 5. There was a great turnout of both neighbors and city employees including those from the Animal Services and Police Departments.

I also had the pleasure of speaking to the Daytimers women group on Tuesday October 12. I am happy that they are able to meet in person again and I was happy to share some developments across the city that I will highlight below.

On the City Council, we have been debating how to spend the \$53.5 million allocated to Garland as a result of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). The funds may be used for a variety of uses including replacing lost revenue as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. We decided to use the funds to supplement the 2019 bond program projects and add several additional projects. Per federal regulations, the funds must be allocated by 2023 and spent by 2026.

Projects which will be funded include expanded sport courts for basketball, tennis, and pickleball at Holford Park, renovations to the North Garland Branch Library, a splash pad at Rick Oden Park, and new shade structures at the recently opened Dog Park.

We also will be adding scope corrections to Fire Stations 1, 6, and 7 projects to provide for individual sleeping quarters for the firefighters to prevent the spread of disease if we ever have another pandemic in the future. Several drainage studies to correct flooding issues will be conducted in the Gatewood and Saturn Springs neighborhoods and additional funding will be allocated to fixing the pavement issues at various railroad crossings around the city.

One project I am most proud of is providing approximately \$8 million to build a tennis complex at Tuckerville Park. The new tennis complex will provide about 20 courts which will allow Garland to become a tournament destination for tennis tournaments in the state. The new facility will replace the existing tennis center at Rick Oden Park.

In District 7, you may have noticed construction at the southeast corner of Arapaho and Shiloh Roads. A new Murphy's Gas Station and Convenience Store is being built there. Soon, construction will begin on a new Starbucks Coffee free-standing store with a drivethru to be built in the parking lot of the Home Depot at the northeast corner of Jupiter and Buckingham. The existing Starbucks across the street in the Albertson's parking lot in Richardson will be closed when the new store opens.



Mulching Your Leaves

Did you know that scientists say to leave some (or all) of your leaves to help beneficial insects survive over the winter? This year consider letting some of the leaves stay put in your yard.

If you do plan to clean up the leaves, consider mulching instead of raking. Why? When you rake up your leaves, it costs you (us all) money. Your local taxes pay for trucks to sweep up your leaves or pick up your leaf bags, all of which often end up in landfills. If

you burn leaves, you're just sending up clouds of carbon into the atmosphere.


Mulching leaves with your lawn mower simply recycles a natural resource, giving you richer soil for "free".

Good Neighbor Spotlight

Good Neighbors are Like Family by Heather Englebretson

A year ago, the husband of one of our elderly neighbors passed away. In the months that followed, I was encouraged (and even a bit surprised) to see just how many neighbors reached out to help this now-widowed neighbor. They checked in on her each week to see if she needed anything or to chat and keep her company. When a storm knocked one of her trees into the street, neighbors came out to help cut and move the tree to the curb for bulky trash. When the hard freeze came to North Texas, neighbors broke up the ice on her slippery walkway and checked to see how she was handling the power outages.

Several months ago her health unexpectedly declined, but her neighbors still continued to support her. They checked to see if she had enough food and groceries. When her ability to drive became limited, neighbors drove her to different appointments. When an ambulance took her to the hospital, neighbors looked after her house, cared for her dog, watered her plants, fed her fish, and picked up her mail. When it was clear she would be passing away soon, neighbors visited her at the hospital. These neighbors had adopted her as part of their family and they cared for her as they would a family member.

It was amazing to see so many neighbors showing such care and compassion—not just once or twice, but consistently and over a period of time. Good neighbors do exist and many of them live right here in Oakridge!
