We presented a check for Officer Barnes through the Garland Police Never Walk Alone Foundation (a charitable organization that helps Garland police officers who are battling illness and struggling to keep up with the medical and travel expenses associated with the treatments).

Oakridge has a 29-year history of doing things for First Responders during the holidays, traditionally in the form of meals or food. However, this year we had a very special mission as we joined together to support Officer Barnes in his fight against metastatic breast cancer.

#### Garland eAssist App

As residents, we often encounter things that need to be reported to the City. This includes missed trash collection, deceased animal in the road, broken streetlights, abandoned cars, and many other issues.

The Garland eAssist app is a fast way to report a wide range of *non-emergency* issues. Popular service requests include parking violations, potholes, streetlights (not traffic lights), trash on private property, graffiti, deceased animal, and standing water in meter box.

Once you submit a request, you will receive email updates letting you know when the request has been received and when it has been resolved. (Emails notifications will be sent to the email address you provide when you first sign up.)



You can access eAssist online (visit <u>GarlandTX.gov</u> and click on the yellow eAssist button) or you can download the free eAssist mobile app from the Apple and Google Play stores.

#### Downtown Garland

Expect some detours in Downtown Garland during construction on the Square. It may be tempting to avoid the area altogether during construction, however, Downtown business owners want Garland residents to know they are still there and are open for business. Many businesses have already been hit hard with the pandemic, they are hopeful that the Downtown construction won't drive more customers away.

Storefront parking may not be available for some businesses during construction. Keep an eye out for signs directing you to available parking areas.

Construction is expected to take 18 to 20 months on the Downtown Square and up to 24 months on the streetscapes in the broader area. November 1 through March 31, Garland water utility customers with an in-ground sprinkler system may water once per week. Customers have the flexibility to choose which day of the week to water.



Watering with a hand-held device, soaker hose, or drip irrigation is allowed any time on any day.



The next meeting of the Oakridge Gentlemen will be held on the third Wednesday of January (the 19th), 10:30 a.m., at the Duck Creek Golf Club. As our guest speaker, we are hoping to have a someone from the Garland Public Health Department to present current information on Garland's response to the latest COVID variant.
