## Oakridge Entrances

Do you know how many entrances there are in the Oakridge neighborhood?

There are 9 entrances. Beginning with the north side then going clockwise around the neighborhood perimeter, here are the entrances: Laurel



Oaks Drive, Richland Drive, Big Oaks Drive, Rich Oak Drive, Winding Oak Trail, Diamond Oaks Drive, Overview Lane, Ridge Oak Drive, and Greenview Drive.

The ONA Environmental Committee, who oversees these entrances, is completely comprised of volunteers. Just like any other volunteer, the time they can donate to volunteering is limited. Like most of you reading this newsletter, these volunteers have family members to care for, jobs to work, and households to manage. They can always use some extra help.

Thankfully, we have a neighborhood full of people who drive/walk/bike through these 9 entrances on a regular basis. This means there are a lot of eyes and ears that can report issues (broken sprinklers, damaged plants, etc.).

## Oakridge Men's Group

#### A Garland Marshal visits the Oakridge Men's Group

Although the Garland Marshals didn't enter the Garland Enforcement Program until a few years ago, Marshals have been in this part of the country for years; back when Texas was just a territory and before it became a state.

Marshals like "Matt Dillon" were here to "keep the peace". Marshal J.D. Norris does part of that enforcement in these modern times, right here in Garland. He wears more than a six-gun. He wears a bullet-proof vest, a taser, handcuffs and enough communications equipment to rival a modern-day Alexander Graham Bell—and he (and other Marshals) can arrest anyone in the state who violates the law.

Marshals are sworn peace officers who perform a wide range of duties, including service of process (process servers) seizing money and property under court order, evictions, serving tax warrants, and arresting individuals on bench warrants. Judicial marshals are employed by the judicial branch. They are enforcers of parking violations and deliver code violators with summons or warnings. Police officers don't handle this any longer.

If a person parks in front of your house, they are not violating the law. If they park next to the mailbox, they are not violating the law. However, if they are parked within 15 feet of a fire hydrant or within 30 feet of a corner or alley entrance, they are violating the law. If a car is blocking your driveway, or parked in your driveway, or parked across your sidewalk, then they are violating the law and you can get in touch with a Marshal to solve your problem.

The best way to get action on many problems—e.g., potholes, broken streetlight, tall grass, or parking situations—is to use Garland's eAssist app. With the eAssist app, you can submit more than 50 types of service requests, including contacting the Marshal's office. Garland's eAssist app provides an online platform accessible from the City's website (www.garlandTX. gov). It is also available as a free app on the Google Play and Apple App stores.
