## City Councilman Update

Earlier this month, the City Council reviewed, debated and passed the city budget for the upcoming fiscal year. This year's proposed comprehensive budget is the biggest in the City's history as it totals \$966.1 million. The budget reflects an increase of \$149.3 million (18.3%) from the FY 2021/2022 adopted combined budget. The budget covers all of the city expenditures including personnel; operations; capital purchases; electric, fuel and energy; water purchases and debt payments

Some budget highlights include funding for public safety including nine firefighter positions to operate three new highway blocker vehicles, SWAT medical equipment and training, and ballistic shield protection equipment, bodyworn cameras and taser cartridges for police officers.

The budget also includes funding to support maintenance and operation costs which will be incurred as the 2019 Bond Projects come online. With a doubling in size of the new Garland Animal Shelter, additional food and kennel labor costs are included. Also, additional parks equipment and chemicals are being purchased to operate our new splash pads and ball fields when they open next summer.

The budget includes \$500,000 for the continuation of the Office of Neighborhood Vitality Home Improvement Program, and we have discussed on council raising the maximum eligible home value to allow more citizens to be eligible for the cost sharing of home improvement projects.

We are upping the city's reserves to \$11.2M which will allow us to react to unexpected financial shortfalls or emergency needs such as tornadoes or flooding.

After not receiving a raise during the pandemic, City staff will receive a 5.0% compensation merit increase. This will help the City better compete in an extremely tight labor market and hopefully provide more financial security to our dedicated city employees during these high inflationary times.

Due to inflationary pressures, the budget requires that we increase average monthly rates for water usage by \$3.43, sewer service by \$2.08, and trash collection by \$2.00. No rate changes are proposed for GP&L electric service and storm water as part of the Proposed Budget. The increase in water service is less than what would have been proposed if we did not have the NTMWD water rate case settlement in October of 2020.

I encourage everyone to go to the City of Garland's webpage and read the proposed budget documents. The 522 page document lays out exactly how every penny of your valuable tax dollars are spent by your local municipal government. As always, we on the City Council strive to be good stewards of the valuable financial resources we are entrusted with through your tax payments.

#### Hello Oakridge!



### Safety Reminders

Keep your garage door closed especially when you are working in the yard or just stepping inside. Open garages are an easy target for thieves.

Pick-up mail in a timely manner and consider going to the Post Office to mail checks or skip the mail and pay electronically. Thieves are looking for packages, checks, or identity information left in mailboxes overnight.

Be a good neighbor. It's always smart to get to know your neighbors. The "rule of 5" is to at least know your neighbors on both sides and 3 across the street or alley. Practice small acts of kindness—smile, wave, or say hello. Be aware of your neighbor's habits, such as when they are generally at work, if they have small children or teenagers, if they are elderly and may need extra assistance from time to time. Be sure to check on your neighbors.

Report suspicious activity. If you see suspicious activity or something (or somebody) that seems out of place, call the Garland Police non-emergency number at 972-485-4840 (or call 911 for emergency or crime in progress). Remember to include details that go beyond race and gender such as behavior, vehicle description, location, time of day, hair, clothing, identifying marks, etc. Share any security camera video that may be helpful with Officer Barnes (BarnesT@garlandtx.gov).
