Crime and Safety

Oakridge prides itself on a long history of active involvement of its members in watching out for one another. The Oakridge Neighborhood Association (ONA) Crime Prevention and Safety Committee serves its mission to improve and maintain the quality of life in Oakridge.

Reminders for Spring

Spring and warmer weather means more people working in the yards or venturing out for vacations. Criminals' activity also increases. The best way to stay safe is neighbors looking out for each other, and the following tips from the Garland Police:

- Lock your cars and Remove valuables including keys, purses, shopping bags, guns, electronics, money, medicine, and jewelry. Thieves love easy targets.
- Keep garage doors closed, especially when you are working in the yard or just stepping inside.
 Open garages are easy targets.
- Meet your neighbors Knowing your neighbors, the cars they drive, habits, and visitors can help to identify suspicious activity and look out for each other.
- Sign up for Vacation Watch list: Free for Garland residents). Download and complete the Request Form (PDF).

Discourage Porch Piracy:

Track deliveries online and quickly retrieve packages.

Crime & Safety continued:

- Have packages delivered to your office or remote pickup site. Amazon hub lockers around the city.
 FedEx and UPS also offer similar options. Walgreens and others offer free delivery to the store.
- · Ask a neighbor to collect packages.
- Get a video doorbell (such as Nest or Ring).
- Add your Video Doorbell to the Garland Video Crime Watch. Complete the survey at https://www.garlandpolice.com/331/Police.

Report suspicious activity. If you see suspicious activity or something (or somebody) that seems out of place, call the non-emergency number at 972-485-4840 (call 911 for emergency or crime in progress). Remember to include details that go beyond race and gender such as behavior, vehicle description, location, time of day, hair, clothing, identifying marks, etc. Share any security camera video that may be helpful with Officer Barnes at <code>BarnesT@garlandtx.gov</code>.

District 7 Update Councilman Dylan Hedrick

At our March 20 Work Session, Ninigret Partners presented the results of their Economic Development Strategic Plan. Ninigret Partners (NP) is an economic development and planning consulting firm who has previously worked on our Medical District strategic redevelopment plan. They were hired again to provide a city-wide plan that analyzed the existing conditions and trends of economic development within our city and provided focus areas and recommendations for future growth. The five key findings are as follows:

- Garland is more than a manufacturing city
- Despite being "built out" Garland still has physical development capacity
- Revenue Generation For Garland Needs To Consider Changes In State Law And Development Potential
- A continued focus is needed on neighborhoods & housing
- Garland needs a focused development effort

Over the past several years, Garland has seen significant growth in its property tax revenue and new construction. To continue to grow and compete with cities around the metroplex for residential, commercial and tourism dollars, Ninigret Partners provided several recommendations.

First they recommend that we create a "destination" to capture more non-local sales tax. This can take the form of an entertainment district, sports arena, major meeting space, indoor water park or even an E-sports arena. Suggested areas where these types of destinations can be built include Harbor Point, Firewheel, S. Garland/Shiloh and the IH-30 corridor or Downtown. To support this destination, we need to expand our lodging options by encouraging more high-quality hotels along highway corridors and boutique hotels to be built downtown. NP recommends updating the zoning codes to include flexible or hybrid business models which may span multiple uses in the current zoning code.

NP suggests that we explore options to provide spaces such as makerspaces or test kitchens to allow for entrepreneurs to develop and launch new small businesses. NP states we should make improvements to our industrial districts by adding spaces for truck staging and parking, addressing stormwater/flood management concerns, and adding amenities to beautify those older districts which have not seen much investment in many years.

As we implement the strategic plan, NP recommends engaging in additional public relations efforts to highlight the redevelopment potential of Garland to attract new and high-quality property developers to new opportunities within the City. We need to continue to improve the physical appearance of our city by focusing on high traffic corridors, shopping center façade improvements, and increasing visibility and access to our natural assets such as creeks, trails, and Ray Hubbard Lake.

Finally, NP wants us to identify specific sites near amenities that may be redeveloped as new housing types. We should also develop a strategy to acquire low quality multi-family housing complexes that may be redeveloped into a higher quality and diverse housing stock.

The entire report goes into much further depth and is worth reading through if you are interested in the future shape of our city. It is available on the City's website at garlandtx.gov.

Most residents are only 2-3 minutes away from receiving help. It makes you feel good, doesn't it?

If an authorized plan, under supervision, can be worked out, this would improve the "look" around Oakridge. Also under discussion: the City of Garland is debating "speed bumps".

If your home is on the outer perimeter, you will be responsible for the repair or replacement of damaged walls on your property. Note: ONA Membership contributions provide for the maintenance, landscaping, and mowing "around" the perimeter walls.

Sidewalk Repairs-City Cost Share Program:

Per Garland's City Ordinance, if you own property in Garland, it is your responsibility to keep sidewalks, parkways, curbs, and driveways adjacent to your property in a good and safe condition and free from any defects and hazards. A property owner who qualifies in all three categories may now bear as little as 10 percent of the cost of fixing their sidewalk.
