Garland City Council, District 7 Update Councilman Dylan Hedrick

The weather is warming up and that means our annual summer festival and music series is ready to begin again. This year's lineup features a wide variety of artists from Latin, blues, rock and Texas country.

The Sounds of Summer concert series starts May 5 and runs every other Friday until June 30. The concerts will be held at either Winters Park or Audubon Park. Go to <u>https://www.VisitGarlandTX.com/SoundsofSummer202</u> <u>3</u> for more information.

Another celebration I am looking forward to is this year's 10th annual Cinco de Mayo celebration. It will be held at Lakewood Brewery on Sunday, May 7, 2023 from 2:00-9:30 pm. Music will be performed by Grupo Romero, Conjunto Cats and the Hometown Boy. If you are looking for a smaller, more intimate setting for music, check out our Band Together concert series every other Friday evening from May through July in downtown. To celebrate its first year of operation, Animal Shelter & Adoption Center hosted a Grand Bonanza Saturday, April 22. Even though the shelter more than doubled its space over the previous shelter, it has been operating at or near capacity daily since its opening. To give you an idea of the numbers, during the month of March, Animal Services Officers answered 1,789 calls for service and removed five animals from cruelty.

The Shelter adopted out 163 animals and took in 427 for the month. This large discrepancy between adoptions and intakes continues to present operational challenges for our staff. I highly encourage you to visit the shelter if you are looking for your next pet like our family did with our new cat Mittens.

Our 2019 Bond Program continues to progress as several projects in District 7 have been awarded or started in the past few weeks. Holford Recreation Center has been completely torn down in preparation for the new center and pool to start construction this summer.



Construction has also started on the 10' wide, mile-long Busby transmission Trail that runs in an existing highvoltage transmission easement north of Apollo Road to Lawrence Drive. At our April 18 council meeting, we awarded the contracts for the design of Holford Road segment C which is the southernmost section connecting to Arapaho Road.

We also approved two design contracts for the Duck Creek-Audubon Trail and the Naaman Forest trail connection. These projects will help to further develop our growing trail system as outlined in our 2021 Trails and Bikeways Master Plan.

Finally, Central Library will close for the next 12-14 months as exterior and interior renovations are completed. Temporary operations will be moved to the nearby 713 Austin Street (formerly the Women's Activities Building) in May. During construction, only limited services will be provided from the Central Library Express location, but you can still visit other branch locations. The Central Library will be getting a new entrance, security improvements and an entirely new facade to bring new life to the building. Interior renovations include reconfiguring the spaces to add new technology, infrastructure improvements and - my kid's favorite - a children's slide from the ground floor level down to the new children's area in the basement. The ONA is a 501(C)(4) Non-Profit chartered in 1992. Its Fiscal Year begins June 1 and ends May 31st of the following year. Membership is Voluntary. Dues are \$60 Annually per household. Oakridge Districts/Directors:

Oakridge neighborhood is comprised of 1166 homes divided up into "Districts" by Street. Each District is represented by an ONA District Director. Click *Find Your District* to locate your District and ONA District Director.

If your home is on the outer perimeter, you will be responsible for the repair or replacement of damaged walls on your property. Note: ONA Membership contributions provide for the maintenance, landscaping, and mowing "around" the perimeter walls.

Sidewalk Repairs-City Cost Share Program:

Per Garland's City Ordinance, if you own property in Garland, it is your responsibility to keep sidewalks, parkways, curbs, and driveways adjacent to your property in a good and safe condition and free from any defects and hazards. A property owner who qualifies in all three categories may now bear as little as 10 percent of the cost of fixing their sidewalk. Find out program details at:


