As construction on our Downtown Square gets closer to completion on October 14 later this year, our Cultural Arts Department has been preparing for the opening as well. On June 15, Cultural Arts filed an application with the Texas Commission on the Arts (TCA) to designate downtown and the surrounding area as a Cultural District Designation.

If accepted, this prestigious state designation would recognize Garland's Bankhead Cultural Arts District for 10 years as one of 52 Cultural Districts in Texas and open State-funding opportunities for programs and improvements within the district. These districts can become focal points for generating businesses, attracting tourists, stimulating cultural development and fostering civic pride.

The rigorous application requires substantial information about the district's visual and musical arts programming and requires an audio visual component. Our application will be reviewed by the TCA in July and August, and we will receive notice about our district status in September, hopefully just in time for the Square's grand opening.

Over 100 volunteers helped get the "yuck out of Duck Creek" armed with waders, gloves, grabbers and trash bags. Per Garland's City Ordinance, if you own property in Garland, it is your responsibility to keep sidewalks, parkways, curbs, and driveways adjacent to your property in a good and safe condition and free from any defects and hazards. A property owner who qualifies in all three categories may now bear as little as 10 percent of the cost of fixing their sidewalk. Find out program details at:
