- Can not do what we do without you!



Garland City Council, District 7

The date has finally been announced for the unveiling of one of the crown jewels of our 2019 Bond Program - The Downtown Square. On October 14, Garland's own LeAnn Rimes will help us celebrate the grand opening with a concert. Festivities will start at 10 a.m. with a ribbon cutting at 3:30 p.m. Garland High School's Mighty Owl Band will march through the downtown streets and the new Square's promenade. The Landmark Museum will have an exhibit titled "Downtown Through Time: Garland's Historic Square" which showcases the history of the Square. Other activities include food trucks and other vendors, a drone light show, children's activities, and a variety of live music throughout the day culminating with a concert from LeAnne Rimes.

City voters approved the Bond Package which included \$25 million towards revitalizing the Downtown Square and 14 surrounding blocks with pedestrian friendly streetscapes and walkability improvements. The Square will now feature a large recreational and event lawn, an observatory treehouse, an imaginative play area, a pavilion for smaller, impromptu performances, an urban water fountain, and a distinctive gateway feature. We hope that these improvements will make the square a community gathering place for generations to come.

If you ever have a question about city services, you are always welcome to reach out to me, but another effective tool is using our eAssist app. The app can be downloaded to your phone (on iPhone and Android formats) and provides a calendar of local events, links to the City's social media accounts, and allows you to make a service request for parking issues, pothole repairs, missed garbage collections, water leaks, animal services, or a variety of other issues.

Usage of the app is up 30% from last year, with 5,802 eAssist "tickets" or requests made though March of this year. Roughly a third of all requests are parking related, with sanitation requests being 28% and Streets and Code Code Compliance being 8% each. All other related requests make up the remainder. In the app, you can see a map of requests made throughout the city, track the status of your requests, and communicate directly with city staff handling the request.

With the increased usage, we are improving our processes internally to improve workflows to make the app more effective for our citizens.

On May 16, the City Council welcomed two new members as District 6 Councilwoman Carissa Dutton and District 8 Councilman Christopher Ott were sworn in. Both won their elections as unopposed candidates after District 6 Councilman Robert Vera and District 8 Councilman Robert John Smith were term-limited and could not run again. Also, Mayor Scott LeMay as Mayor and myself in District 7 were re-elected for our third and final terms, and Councilman Ed Moore was re-elected to his second term in District 3. We all look forward to serving the community and continuing to move the city forward through the implementation of our bond program, improvement program, economic and development projects.

Finally, with the new council term comes new appointments to boards and commissions. Serving on a board or commission is a great opportunity to become involved with local government and many of our boards and commissions help to serve as advisors to the City Council to help us form policy. If you are interested in serving your city, I encourage you to visit https://www.garlandtx.gov/282/Boards-Commissions and looking over the various board and commissions on the left hand side of the page, filling out a PDF application and sending it to the City Secretary. Right now I have vacancies on the Environmental & Community Advisory Board and two Tax Increment Financing Boards.

There are so many interesting people with many wonderful careers who live in Oakridge. Diane Sherer is one of them and the Oakridge Men's Group had the honor of meeting her at the May meeting.

Diane lives with her husband, Rusty. She is a World Class Marathon Runner and has run the World-Renowned Boston Marathon, and more than once with medals to show. Born in Lubbock; schooled at Texas Tech, she loves the Red Raiders and loves to run. Her Dad was "into sports", and that interest was passed along. The White Rock Lake Marathon was Diane's first big running event. She also ran the Airforce Marathon, the Dallas, San Antonio, Houston, and Ft Worth Marathons. These were all testing runs for the Bean-town event. And to qualify for that, you had run the 26 plus Marathon miles in less than 4 hours. Is it "tough"? You bet! Several runners have died during the event.

Diane was also a witness to the Boston Marathon bombing April 15th, 2013 two Brothers planted two homemade pressure cooker bombs, which detonated near the finish line of the race 14 seconds and 210 yards (190 m) apart. Three people were killed and hundreds injured, including 17 who lost limbs. She had to come back the next year to pick up her medals.

Sidewalk Repairs-City Cost Share Program:

Per Garland's City Ordinance, if you own property in Garland, it is your responsibility to keep sidewalks, parkways, curbs, and driveways adjacent to your property in a good and safe condition and free from any defects and hazards. A property owner who qualifies in all three categories may now bear as little as 10 percent of the cost of fixing their sidewalk. Find out program details at:
