Environmental Update

Cecile LaBossiere, Environmental Committee

I hope everyone is managing to keep themselves cool during the Sizzling Texas Summer!

Our Oakridge environmental team has been busy at work managing the landscaping at the entrances and ensuring the watering schedules are set to keep the shrubs and seasonal flowers alive.

You may have seen the volunteer crew working at several of the entrances during the months of June-July. We recently transitioned from our long time Environmental Director, David Parrish (Thank you David for over 20 years of service to the ONA) to a new volunteer team, Oliver Harter, Jackie Jones, Dan Nichols, and Cecile LaBossiere. David had quite a job to do and fortunately for the new team, we had a great instruction book to follow, so we could ensure that the transition went smoothly.

Our new team has been busy at the entrances:

- Big Oaks and Richland Drive: Sprinkler valve and several sprinkler heads have been replaced. The city has turned the water back on and we are now watering both entrances.
- Laurel Oaks Drive: Four broken pipes repaired and three sprinkler heads replaced, and we are now watering both flower beds and the median.
- Ridge Oaks Drive: One broken pipe has been repaired and two sprinkler heads were replaced, and we are watering both flower beds and the median
- Overview Drive: We cleaned 6 sprinkler heads and are now watering both flower beds.
- Diamond Oaks Drive: Sprinkler Valve has been replaced and several sprinkler heads have been replaced and cleaned. We are watering both flower beds.

Environmental continued.

Our watering schedule is set for Tuesday and Saturday mornings, so if you see any unusual amounts of water on the street, please let us know so we can correct any sprinkler leaks quickly.

Our environmental team has been enjoying seeing our neighbors. There has been a lot of waves and greetings while completing repairs and maintenance.

Thanks to everyone that has waved to us and stopped to say "Thank You". It means a lot to us to know that the community cares and supportive of our efforts.

We would like to thank our ONA members for their contributions that allow us to continue maintaining the landscaping, lighting, and sprinkler system at the entrances and perimeter. Your ONA contributions also pay for the utility bills associated with watering and lighting the entrances, and we couldn't make this happen without you.

Garland City Council, District 7

As the hot summer continues, I invite you to cool off at the newest and most fun bond project to open to the public yet. On July 13th, Garland's first splash pad opened at Embree Park. This is the first of three splash pads planned in the city as part of the 2019 Bond Program. The other two are planned for Lon Wynne Park and Watson Park.

On its first day, hundreds of kids were out enjoying the fountains, tipping buckets and waterfalls. You can see a video of the first day smiles here: https://youtu.be/EhWQgZEhOcA. The splash pad is open from 8:00 AM to 8:00 PM until September 30. You may see me with my kids out there next weekend!

Our third Build Garland Day is scheduled for Saturday, July 22. This is a day where the City Council travels to various locations around the city to celebrate groundbreakings or ribbon cuttings of newly opened or upcoming bond projects. This time we will travel to Holford Recreation & Neighborhood Aquatic Center and the West Garland Branch Library for groundbreakings, and the new Tinsley Park playground for a ribbon-cutting. Tinsley Park is one of 25 parks to receive new playgrounds each with a different theme. Tinsley will feature a nature theme with a large climbing rock designed to look like a giant wolf head, log beams and log steppers, climbing boulders, tree swing, and an extra-large turtle structure.

At our July 11th City Council meeting, a Special Use Provision for a new car wash in District 7 near the northwest corner of Belt Line Road and Shiloh Road was denied. In March of this year, Ninigret Partners completed an Economic Development Strategic Plan, which provided a framework for the smart development of Garland into the future.

City Councilman Continued

The report on page 69 states that we must be selective about development requests approves, especially those that do not support the Strategic Plan. I voted to reject the request because I did not buy the developer's argument during the hearing that the car wash will serve as a catalyst to bring new restaurants and retail sites to the area, nor did I think that the new car wash provides the highest and best use of land considering the limited open space remaining available to develop and the preponderance of existing car washes surrounding the site. Per Garland's City Ordinance, if you own property in Garland, it is your responsibility to keep sidewalks, parkways, curbs, and driveways adjacent to your property in a good and safe condition and free from any defects and hazards.
