Oakridge Safety

Joan & Dan Nichols, Crime & Safety

Oakridge prides itself on a long history of active involvement of its members in watching out for one another. The Oakridge Neighborhood Association (ONA), through its Crime Prevention and Safety Committee, serves the ONA's mission to improve and maintain the quality of life in Oakridge.

REMINDERS FOR SPRING

Spring and warmer weather are on the way which means more people may be working in the yards or venturing out for vacations. Criminals are also out and about. The best way to stay safe is with neighbors looking out for each other. Here are some tips from the Garland Police for keeping yourself and your neighbors safe.

Especially in the spring -

- Keep garage doors closed, especially when you are working in the yard or just stepping inside. Open garages are an easy target for thieves.
- Meet your neighbors Knowing your neighbors, the cars they drive, habits, and visitors can help to identify suspicious activity and look out for each other. Coming to the ONA events (district pop-ups, Spring Membership Drive) is a great way to meet your neighbors and have fun!
- Vacation Watch Request (free for Garland residents).
 If you plan to be out of town, consider having Volunteers in Policing check your home while you are gone. You can go to the Garland Police website to complete the Vacation Watch Request form

And all the time -

- Lock your cars to help deter thieves who are looking for an easy target.
- Remove valuables from your car including keys, purses, shopping bags, guns, electronics, money, medicine, and jewelry.
- Discourage Porch Pirates with the following:
 - Track deliveries online and quickly retrieve packages from your porch as soon as they are delivered.
 - Have packages delivered to your office building or remote pickup site. Amazon has several hub lockers around the city. FedEx and UPS also offer similar options. Walgreens and others offer free delivery to the store.
 - Ask your neighbor to collect packages from your porch when you are away from home.
 - Get a video doorbell (Nest or Ring). They may not always stop a Porch Pirate in their tracks, but they can help the police identify them later.

Crime & Safety Continued

- Video doorbells like Ring can be good deterrent and aid police in catching criminals (even if it is blurry). Add yours to the Garland Video Crime Watch by going to http://www.garlandpolice.com/331/Police to complete a short survey.
- Report suspicious activity. If you see suspicious activity or something (or somebody) that seems out of place, call the non-emergency number at 972-485-4840 (or call 911 for emergency or crime in progress). Remember to include details that go beyond race and gender such as behavior, vehicle description, location, time of day, hair, clothing, identifying marks, etc. Share any security camera video that may be helpful with Officer Murphy at MurphyJ@garlandtx.gov.

Garland City Council, District 7

Councilman Dylan Hedrick

On May 4, Garland will hold an election for council districts 1, 2, 4, and 5, as well as 17 City Charter amendments. The current council members in Districts 1 (Jeff Bass), 4 (BJ Williams) and 5 (Margaret Lucht) do not have opponents and will be returning for another two years. In District 2, either Eric Stuyvesant and Kris Beard will replace the outgoing council member Deborah Morris who is term limited.

Even though there is not a council race to vote in if you live in District 7, I still encourage you to go to the polls and vote on the 17 City Charter amendments. The amendments cover a range of issues proposed by the city council, the charter review committee, and the city attorney's office. A brief description of the charter changes is here:

- Proposition A: An amendment to redefine "term" to mean in excess of annual consecutive statutory election dates
- Proposition B: An amendment to mirror state redistricting law of 10-year intervals
- Proposition C: An amendment to add protections against gerrymandering
- Proposition D: An amendment to the qualifications of Council members
- Proposition E: An amendment to increase the compensation for Mayor and Council members
- Proposition F: An amendment to add genderneutral language consistent with the rest of the charter
- Proposition G: An amendment to add a reference to the Deputy Mayor Pro Tem position on Council
- Proposition H: An amendment to add a 30-day deadline for the Governor to respond to an election petition from the City before the City Council can fulfill the vacancy by appointment
- Proposition I: An amendment to clarify the Council-appointed positions to which the removal procedure applies
- Proposition J: An amendment to change the enforcement procedure of improper communication with appointments to be pursuant to the City's Code of Ethics
- Propositions K-M: Amendments to change the allowed contract of the City Auditor, City Manager and City Attorney to not exceed five years

Councilman update continued:

- Proposition N: An amendment to clarify the circumstances of the Mayor's appointment to a vacancy on the Plan Commission
- Proposition O: An amendment to simplify and clarify the zoning powers of the City to be consistent with City ordinances and state law
- Proposition P: An amendment to add the allowance of delegation of certain plat approval pursuant to recent changes in state law
- Proposition Q: An amendment to remove the specific reference to May and be consistent with any statutorily designated uniform election date

I support all of the changes with the exception of item E. A full list of the proposed charter changes can be found on the City's website:

The ONA is a 501(C)(4) Non-Profit chartered in 1992. Its powers and authority is limited to the maintenance of 9 Entries and subdivision perimeter landscaping. The ONA has no authority over and takes no position over private property matters. The Fiscal Year begins June 1 and ends May 31st of the following year. Membership is voluntary. Oakridge Districts/Directors:

Oakridge is comprised of 1166 homes divided up into "Districts" by Street. Each District is represented by an ONA District Director. Click *Find Your District* to locate your District and ONA District Director.

ONA Membership dues provide for the maintenance, landscaping, and mowing "around" the perimeter walls. If your home is on the outer perimeter, you will be responsible for the repair or replacement of damaged walls on your property. Per Garland's City Ordinance, if you own property in Garland, it is your responsibility to keep sidewalks, parkways, curbs, and driveways adjacent to your property in a good and safe condition and free from any defects and hazards. A property owner who qualifies in all three categories may now bear as little as 10 percent of the cost of fixing their sidewalk.
