Oakridge Safety

Oakridge prides itself on a long history of active involvement of its members in watching out for one another. The Oakridge Neighborhood Association (ONA), through its Crime Prevention and Safety Committee, serves the ONA's mission to improve and maintain the quality of life in Oakridge.

REMINDERS FOR SPRING

Spring and warmer weather are on the way which means more people may be working in the yards or venturing out for vacations. Criminals are also out and about. The best way to stay safe is with neighbors looking out for each other. Here are some tips from the Garland Police for keeping yourself and your neighbors safe.

Especially in the spring -

- Keep garage doors closed, especially when you are working in the yard or just stepping inside. Open garages are an easy target for thieves.
- Meet your neighbors Knowing your neighbors, the cars they drive, habits, and visitors can help to identify suspicious activity and look out for each other. Coming to the ONA events (district pop-ups, Spring Membership Drive) is a great way to meet your neighbors and have fun!
- Vacation Watch Request (free for Garland residents).
 If you plan to be out of town, consider having Volunteers in Policing check your home while you are gone. You can go to the Garland Police website to complete the Vacation Watch Request form

And all the time -

- Lock your cars to help deter thieves who are looking for an easy target.
- Remove valuables from your car including keys, purses, shopping bags, guns, electronics, money, medicine, and jewelry.
- Discourage Porch Pirates with the following:
 - Track deliveries online and quickly retrieve packages from your porch as soon as they are delivered.

Crime & Safety Continued

- Have packages delivered to your office building or remote pickup site. Amazon has several hub lockers around the city. FedEx and UPS also offer similar options. Walgreens and others offer free delivery to the store.
- Ask your neighbor to collect packages from your porch when you are away from home.
- Get a video doorbell (Nest or Ring). They may not always stop a Porch Pirate in their tracks, but they can help the police identify them later.
- Video doorbells like Ring can be good deterrent and aid police in catching criminals (even if it is blurry). Add yours to the Garland Video Crime Watch by going to http://www.garlandpolice.com/331/Police to complete a short survey.

• Report suspicious activity. If you see suspicious activity or something (or somebody) that seems out of place, call the non-emergency number at 972-485-4840 (or call 911 for emergency or crime in progress). Remember to include details that go beyond race and gender such as behavior, vehicle description, location, time of day, hair, clothing, identifying marks, etc. Share any security camera video that may be helpful with Officer Murphy at MurphyJ@garlandtx.gov.



Garland City Council, District 7

Councilman Dylan Hedrick

On May 11, we celebrated our fourth annual Build Garland Day where the City Council traveled to the groundbreakings of several new facilities that were funded as part of the 2019 Bond Program. Our first stop was Hollabaugh Recreation Center where we cut the ribbon on the renovated recreation center. The centerpiece was the new basketball court and multi-purpose meeting space including a renovated kitchen.

Our next stop took us to Watson Park where we partnered with Texas Parks and Wildlife to share the costs of the improvements. We cut the ribbon on the newest splash pad in Garland, which was the fourth of five planned for the City. The final one planned for Rick Oden Park is still in the design phase.

The basketball court at Watson Park was resurfaced and Garland's first futsal court was installed. Futsal is a version of soccer that is played with a weighted ball on a smaller court with lots of passing and ball skills required. I'm sure my daughter will be out playing on the futsal court this summer while I'm with my son at the splash pad.

Our last stop was the Police Simunitions Training Facility. The former police evidence storage building was renovated into a state-of-the-art training facility used to simulate real world conditions our officers may encounter. The building includes multiple rooms with movable walls that can be configured to provide various training scenarios. One room looks like a hotel room, another a grocery store, and another a street scene. The lights can be adjusted to simulate day or night and the sound system can simulate conditions such as chants from a riot to put more pressure on the trainees.

Council members were given the opportunity to run through a few scenarios including a suicidal person with a knife, an armed person threatening his partner in a store, and a protesters at a riot becoming violent. Even in that controlled environment, it was stressful, and it helped me realize what our brave officers have to deal with each day.

Our goal as a City is to provide the best training for our officers so that they know how to respond to a dangerous situation and achieve the best outcome.

Over the past decade in response to national events, there has been a greater focus on providing the highest quality training to our officers and the City Council is dedicated to just that. I encourage you to watch the video from that day at <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=6ELtbqg6iic</u>.

This June will begin our annual budgeting season as the Council will meet in an all day work session June 29. This year, my goal in my final year of my term is fourfold:

Implement a cost of living adjustment (COLA) for our city retirees.

Analyze and allocate street repair funding based on the data received from our complete streets analysis that is finishing this month.

Finish the current Bond Program and prepare for a new bond election based on the results of the Bond Study Committee's recommendations.

Continue the Economic Development program through smart, strategic purchases of property and the quick disbursement of those properties to developers through partnerships for reconstruction.

There is a lot of work to be done, and I am so honored to serve as your District 7 representative. 

Per Garland's City Ordinance, if you own property in Garland, it is your responsibility to keep sidewalks, parkways, curbs, and driveways adjacent to your property in a good and safe condition and free from any defects and hazards. A property owner who qualifies in all three categories may now bear as little as 10 percent of the cost of fixing their sidewalk.
