Garland City Council, District 7 Update Councilman Dylan Hedrick

As I write this final monthly update as your City Council representative, I want to take a moment to express my deep appreciation for the opportunity to serve you. Representing the Oakridge community and all of District 7 on the Garland City Council for the past six years has been one of the greatest honors of my life. Together, we've made real progress, and I leave this role optimistic about our city's future.

As I look back on the accomplishments we have achieved during my time on the council, I am most proud of the progress we have made in implementing the 2019 Bond projects and programs. The entire bond program is approximately 75% complete, with the remainder expected to be finished within three years. The City has a new animal shelter, the Downtown Square has been completely revitalized, a new Fire Station 6 has opened (with two more set to begin construction soon), and the Holford Recreation and Aquatics Center—the largest in the City—will open to the public on May 1.

I hope you were able to join us for Build Garland Day on April 25, celebrating even more ribbon cuttings and groundbreakings from the 2019 Bond Program. If you missed it, I encourage you to view the video recap on the City's Facebook or YouTube page.

Among the celebrations of progress, the business of the City Council continues. This past month, we took two important steps reflecting our ongoing commitment to both fiscal responsibility and economic growth.





First, I'm proud to report that we voted to increase the homestead exemption by 1% for homeowners in Garland—a move that will provide direct property tax relief and help residents keep more of what they've earned. Additionally, we approved an increase in the senior tax exemption by \$4,000, reaffirming our dedication to supporting our long-time residents and those living on fixed incomes. These changes will go into effect in the coming tax year and represent a step in the right direction as we work to balance growth with affordability.

Second, we approved an economic development agreement for The Owl Ice House, a new destination coming to the Downtown Square. This exciting addition, which will fill the former Jones Hardware Building, is more than just a restaurant and entertainment venue—it symbolizes the growing momentum in our efforts to revitalize Downtown Garland. I believe The Owl Ice House will bring new life, jobs, and visitors to our historic square, complementing recent improvements and transforming it into a vibrant gathering place for everyone in our city.

As I prepare to step away from this position, I do so with a heart full of gratitude. Thank you for your trust, your input, and your unwavering commitment to our neighborhood and City. The future of Garland—and Oakridge—is bright, and I look forward to staying involved as a fellow resident and advocate. Sharon started our meeting on a solemn note as we marked the passing of Peggy. We all shared how important she has been to us and discussed supporting her family, as they could use some help when they are in town. Fortunately, our group enables us all to find the support we need through difficult times. I am so thankful that we have each other to lean on.

Our guest speaker this month was Katie Keyworth, Development Director for Good Samaritans of Garland. She thanked us for our support of the Good Samaritans, as the Oakridge Neighborhood Association has sponsored many food drives and has been very generous in helping. She provided an update on their move to a new location, a city-owned library that is no longer in use. This new space will enable them to improve their food distribution center and allow for easier check-in of clients. It was fascinating to hear how they support homeless individuals, families, and others who are food insecure. The food they provide is sourced from individual donations, corporate donations, and the North Texas Food Bank. Katie also mentioned that corporate donations are coming in from many grocery chains.

Thankfully, items nearing their expiration dates can be gathered and redistributed to those in need! They are also pursuing donations from restaurants. Of course, this piqued my curiosity, so I looked into the food waste statistics: Did you know that food waste constitutes about 24% of the material found in municipal solid waste landfills? It is the largest single category of material disposed of in landfills, and because most of it is organic, it also contributes to methane emissions!

Our next meeting will be our last for the year and will feature our end-of-year luncheon! The event will be catered, and Sharon needs volunteers to help with setup and cleanup. Don't forget to volunteer if you have the ability and the time!


Oakridge Districts/Directors:

Oakridge Perimeter Walls:

ONA Membership dues provide for the maintenance, landscaping, and mowing "around" the perimeter walls. If your home is on the outer perimeter, you will be responsible for the repair or replacement of damaged walls on your property. Per Garland's City Ordinance, if you own property in Garland, it is your responsibility to keep sidewalks, parkways, curbs, and driveways adjacent to your property in a good and safe condition and free from any defects and hazards. A property owner who qualifies in all three categories may now bear as little as 10 percent of the cost of fixing their sidewalk.
